4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 12.117, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
7	(d) This subsection applies only to an open-enrollment
8	charter school with an enrollment greater than 200 students that is
9	located in a county with a population of less than 400,000 that
10	contains a municipality with a population of at least 300,000.
11	Notwithstanding Section 12.111(a)(13), an open-enrollment charter
12	school to which this subsection applies may admit a child of an
13	employee of the school as provided by this section regardless of
14	whether the child resides in the geographic area served by the
15	school.
16	SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
17	school year.
18	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
19	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
20	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
21	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

22 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
