H.B. No. 2210

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the consideration for public school accountability
3 purposes of certain students receiving residential services in
4 state hospitals.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 39, Education Code, is
7 amended by adding Section 39.0552 to read as follows:

8 Sec. 39.0552. CERTAIN STUDENTS RECEIVING RESIDENTIAL
9 SERVICES IN STATE HOSPITALS NOT CONSIDERED FOR ACCOUNTABILITY
10 PURPOSES. Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, in
11 determining the performance of a school district or campus under
12 this chapter, a student receiving residential services in a state
13 hospital is not considered a student of the school district or
14 campus in which the state hospital is physically located.

15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
19 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

1 Amend H.B. No. 2210 (senate committee printing) as follows:

2 (1) In SECTION 1 of the bill, strike added Section 39.0552
3 (page 1, lines 28 through 34), and substitute the following:

4 Sec. 39.0552. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN SCHOOL
5 DISTRICT AND STATE HOSPITAL FOR ACCOUNTABILITY PURPOSES. A
6 memorandum of understanding between a school district and a state
7 hospital under which the district provides educational services to
8 a student who resides in the state hospital must provide that the
9 school district include the performance of the student on an
10 assessment instrument or other achievement indicator adopted under
11 Section 39.053 or a reporting indicator adopted under Section
12 39.301 in determining the performance of that school district.

13 (2) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the
14 bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

15 SECTION __. This Act applies to a memorandum of understanding
16 entered into between a school district and a state hospital before,
17 on, or after the effective date of this Act. A memorandum of
18 understanding entered into before the effective date of this Act
19 must be amended as soon as practicable after the effective date of
20 this Act.
