AN ACT 1 relating to the sunset review of the Texas Health Services 2 Authority and the repeal of certain provisions affecting the 3 electronic exchange of health information. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 182, Health and Safety 6 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 182.004 to read as follows: 8 Sec. 182.004. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Texas Health Services Authority is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code 9 (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by 10 that chapter, the corporation is abolished and this section, 11 Section 182.001, and Subchapters B and C expire September 1, 2027. 12 SECTION 2. The following provisions of the Health and 13 Safety Code are repealed: 14(1) Section 182.003; 15 (2) Section 182.052; 16 Section 182.101(b); 17 (3) (4) Section 182.102(c); 18 (5) Section 182.103(d); 19 (6) Section 182.104(b); 20 21 (7) Section 182.105(b); (8) Section 182.106(b); 22 (9) Section 182.107(d); and 23 24 (10) Section 182.108(f).
