7	(d) Notwithstanding any other law, a municipality may not
8	enforce in its extraterritorial jurisdiction a municipal
9	ordinance, regulation, or other measure that imposes cut and fill
10	depth requirements or other water quality regulations on a project
11	that are more stringent than the applicable minimum state and
12	federal water quality requirements unless the project is located in
13	an area that is an aquifer recharge or contributing zone, or in the
14	drainage basin of a river designated by the Texas Commission on
15	Environmental Quality as having high or exceptional aquatic life
16	use in the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards.
17	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
18	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
19	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
20	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
