| 5 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 6 | SECTION 1. Chapter 276, Election Code, is amended by adding |
| 7 | Section 276.015 to read as follows: |
| 8 | Sec. 276.015. DOOR TO DOOR VOTER REGISTRATION AND POLITICAL |
| 9 | MESSAGING. (a) In this section, "residential unit" includes a |
| 10 | single-family house, a single-family house located in a residential |
| 11 | subdivision or housing development, an apartment, a condominium, or |
| 12 | another unit in a multifamily residential structure. |
| 13 | (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a political |
| 14 | subdivision, property owners' association, homeowners' |
| 15 | association, or property manager may not adopt or enforce a rule, |
| 16 | order, ordinance, or policy that prevents an individual from |
| 17 | knocking on the front door of a residential unit, ringing the |
| 18 | doorbell of the unit, or leaving a pamphlet, flier, or other form of |
| 19 | written communication at the unit for the purpose of: |
| 20 | (1) assisting an occupant of the unit with registering |
| 21 | to vote; or |
| 22 | (2) communicating to an occupant of the unit support |
| 23 | or opposition for: |
| 24 | (A) a candidate for nomination or election to |

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- 1 public office or office of a political party;
- 2 (B) a political party; or
- 3 (C) a measure, as defined by Section 251.001.
- 4 (c) A political subdivision, property owners' association,
- 5 homeowners' association, or property manager may adopt and enforce
- 6 <u>a reasonable restriction on the time</u>, place, or manner of an
- 7 <u>activity described by Subsection (b).</u>
- 8 <u>(d) A peace officer, as that term is described by Article</u>
- 9 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or private party may not prevent
- 10 an individual from engaging in an activity described by Subsection
- 11 (b) unless the officer or party reasonably believes that the
- 12 <u>activity poses a threat to a person or property or is in violation</u>
- 13 of a statute, ordinance, order, rule, or policy.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 15 last day of the legislative session.
