A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to ballots voted by mail.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 87.021, Election Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 87.021. BALLOTS AND OTHER MATERIALS DELIVERED TO
- 7 BOARD. The early voting clerk shall deliver to the early voting
- 8 ballot board:
- 9 (1) in an election in which regular paper ballots are
- 10 used for early voting by personal appearance, each ballot box, in
- 11 accordance with Section 85.032(b), containing the early voting
- 12 ballots voted by personal appearance and the clerk's key to each
- 13 box;
- 14 (2) the jacket envelopes containing the early voting
- 15 ballots voted by mail, regardless of the ballot type or voting
- 16 system used;
- 17 (3) the poll lists prepared in connection with early
- 18 voting by personal appearance;
- 19 (4) the list of registered voters used in conducting
- 20 early voting; [and]
- 21 (5) a ballot transmittal form that includes a
- 22 statement of the number of early voting ballots voted by mail,
- 23 regardless of the ballot type or voting system used, that are
- 24 delivered to the early voting ballot board, and in an election in

- 1 which regular paper ballots are used for early voting by personal
- 2 appearance, the number of names appearing on the poll lists
- 3 prepared in connection with early voting by personal appearance;
- 4 (6) copies of the applications for ballots to be voted
- 5 by mail for each ballot voted by mail received; and
- 6 (7) copies of the voter's signature from the voter's
- 7 application for voter registration.
- 8 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 87, Election Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 87.0405 to read as follows:
- Sec. 87.0405. REVIEW OF APPLICATION FOR BALLOT TO BE VOTED
- 11 BY MAIL. Before reviewing a carrier envelope certificate, the
- 12 early voting ballot board shall review each application for a
- 13 ballot to be voted by mail that correlates with the carrier envelope
- 14 to determine if the signature on the ballot application was
- 15 executed by a person other than the voter, unless the application
- 16 was signed by a witness. The early voting clerk shall make
- 17 available for review signatures for each applicant for a ballot to
- 18 be voted by mail from the previous six years.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 87.126, Election Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 87.126. ELECTRONIC RECORDING OF <u>CERTAIN</u> [BALLOT]
- 22 MATERIALS USED IN EARLY VOTING BY MAIL [AND APPLICATIONS]. (a) The
- 23 early voting clerk may electronically record applications for a
- 24 ballot to be voted by mail, jacket envelopes, the front and back of
- 25 carrier envelopes, and ballots.
- 26 (b) The early voting clerk shall have software available to
- 27 display all electronically available signatures together. The

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- 1 software must be made available for the first election following an
- 2 update of the software the early voting clerk uses under this
- 3 section that occurs after December 31, 2021.
- 4 <u>(c)</u> The secretary of state may adopt rules providing
- 5 requirements for the electronic image quality and storage of the
- 6 electronic images of the documents described by this section
- 7 [Subsection (a)].
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 13 legislative session.
