- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2054.1125, Government Code, is
- 6 transferred to Subchapter R, Chapter 2054, Government Code,
- 7 redesignated as Section 2054.603, Government Code, and amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 2054.603 [2054.1125]. SECURITY INCIDENT [BREACH]
- 10 NOTIFICATION BY STATE AGENCY OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT. (a) In this
- 11 section:
- 12 (1) "Security incident" means the unauthorized
- 13 access, disclosure, exposure, modification, or destruction of
- 14 sensitive personal information, confidential information, or other
- 15 information the disclosure of which is regulated by law, including:
- 16 <u>(A) a breach ["Breach</u>] of system <u>security as</u>
- 17 <u>defined</u> [security" has the meaning assigned] by Section 521.053,
- 18 Business & Commerce Code; and
- 19 <u>(B) ransomware as defined by Section 33.023,</u>
- 20 <u>Penal Code</u>.
- 21 (2) "Sensitive personal information" has the meaning
- 22 assigned by Section 521.002, Business & Commerce Code.
- 23 (b) A state agency or local government that owns, licenses,
- 24 or maintains computerized data that includes sensitive personal

- 1 information, confidential information, or information the
- 2 disclosure of which is regulated by law shall, in the event of a
- 3 security incident [breach or suspected breach of system security or
- 4 an unauthorized exposure of that information]:
- 5 (1) comply with the notification requirements of
- 6 Section 521.053, Business & Commerce Code, to the same extent as a
- 7 person who conducts business in this state; [and]
- 8 (2) not later than 72 [48] hours after the discovery of
- 9 the security incident [breach, suspected breach, or unauthorized
- 10 exposure], notify:
- 11 (A) the department, including the chief
- 12 information security officer, and the Texas Division of Emergency
- 13 Management; or
- 14 (B) if the security incident [breach, suspected
- 15 breach, or unauthorized exposure] involves election data, the
- 16 secretary of state; and
- 17 (3) comply with all department rules relating to
- 18 security incidents.
- 19 (c) Not later than the 10th business day after the date of
- 20 the eradication, closure, and recovery from a security incident
- 21 [breach, suspected breach, or unauthorized exposure], a state
- 22 agency or local government shall notify the department, including
- 23 the chief information security officer, and the Texas Division of
- 24 Emergency Management of the details of the security incident
- 25 [event] and include in the notification an analysis of the cause of
- 26 the security incident [event].
- 27 (d) The department shall make available to state agencies

- 1 and local governments a secure method for submitting the security
- 2 <u>incident information required by this section</u>. All information
- 3 provided under this section is confidential and is not subject to
- 4 <u>disclosure under Chapter 552.</u>
