## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, A full and generous life devoted to the service of
his nation has drawn to a close with the death of retired U.S. Army
Colonel Ralph C. Gauer Sr. on June 3, 2021; and

WHEREAS, A native of Chicago, Ralph Gauer received his 4 bachelor's degree from Loyola University, and in June 1958, he 5 joined the U.S. Army and embarked on a distinguished military 6 career that spanned three decades; he served around the world, 7 including assignments with special operations units in Central and 8 9 South America, Vietnam, and Korea, and later in life, he earned a master's degree in government from the University of Maryland and 10 graduated from the U.S. Army War College and the National War 11 12 College; and

WHEREAS, Over the course of his exemplary 31-year tenure in 13 14 the army, Colonel Gauer was the senior staff intelligence officer for the 1st Cavalry Division and the III Corps, where he later 15 16 became interim chief of staff; he also served as Deputy C2 of the United States/Republic of Korea Combined Forces Command, and he 17 18 commanded the 312th Military Intelligence Battalion and the 504th Military Intelligence Brigade; in addition, he served many faculty 19 assignments at the army's John F. Kennedy Special Warfare Center 20 21 and School at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, where he eventually became director of its School of International Studies; and 22

23 WHEREAS, After retiring from the army in 1990, Colonel Gauer 24 started his own business, RCG Media Services, which provided

1 military and international news reports to television stations; in 2 1997, he settled in Austin, where he worked for State Senator Troy 3 Fraser on veterans and national defense issues and served as vice 4 chair of the Texas Military Preparedness Commission; he retired 5 again in 2017, but he remained active in veterans and military 6 issues as a leading member of the Association of the U.S. Army; and

7 WHEREAS, Colonel Gauer's numerous military decorations 8 included the Legion of Merit and the Bronze Star Medal, and in 9 civilian life, he earned the Spirit of America Medal from the Good 10 Soldier Foundation, the Armed Services YMCA Volunteer Excellence 11 Award, and the Jefferson Award for Public Service from the American 12 Institute for Public Service, among other honors; and

WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Colonel Gauer enjoyed the love and support of his wife, Mary; he was the proud father of four children, Ralph, Todd, Laura, and the late Joseph August Gauer III, and he was blessed with a granddaughter, Katherine, and a great-granddaughter, Isla; and

WHEREAS, A distinguished soldier and a dedicated public servant, Ralph Gauer will be deeply missed, but the patriotism, integrity, and dedication to duty that defined his life will forever inspire all those who had the good fortune to know him; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas Legislature, 1st Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the memory of Ralph C. Gauer Sr. and extend heartfelt sympathy to the members of his family and to his many friends; and, be it further
