12 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mr. Sims enjoyed the love and support of his wife of 37 years, Tina, and he took great pride in his 13 14 five children, Malinda, Chrystal, Jennifer, Randy, and Jessica, and his 20 grandchildren; active in his community, he regularly 15 16 participated in livestock shows and other events that benefited the Mullin Independent School District; over the course of his 28 years 17 at TDCJ, he served as a mentor to many and was highly esteemed for 18 his selfless and generous nature; and 19

20 WHEREAS, Randall Sims faithfully and ably performed his 21 duties throughout his tenure with the Texas Department of Criminal 22 Justice, and he will long be remembered with great admiration by all 23 who were privileged to know him; now, therefore, be it
