3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 84.001(b), Election Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	(b) An application must be in writing and signed by the
7	applicant using ink on paper. An electronic signature or
8	<pre>photocopied signature is not permitted.</pre>
9	SECTION 2. Section 84.002, Election Code, as effective
10	September 1, 2021, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding
11	Subsection (d) to read as follows:
12	(a) An early voting ballot application must include:
13	(1) the applicant's name and the address at which the
14	applicant is registered to vote;
15	(1-a) the following information:
16	(A) the number of the applicant's driver's
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- 17 license or personal identification card issued by the Department of
- Public Safety that has not expired or that expired no earlier than 18
- four years before the date of application; or 19
- 20 (B) if the applicant has not been issued a number
- 21 described by Paragraph (A), the last four digits of the applicant's
- 22 social security number;
- 23 (2) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail
- on the ground of absence from the county of residence, the address 24

- 1 outside the applicant's county of residence to which the ballot is
- 2 to be mailed;
- 3 (3) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail
- 4 on the ground of age or disability, the address of the hospital,
- 5 nursing home or other long-term care facility, or retirement
- 6 center, or of a person related to the applicant within the second
- 7 degree by affinity or the third degree by consanguinity, as
- 8 determined under Chapter 573, Government Code, if the applicant is
- 9 living at that address and that address is different from the
- 10 address at which the applicant is registered to vote;
- 11 (4) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail
- 12 on the ground of confinement in jail, the address of the jail or of a
- 13 person related to the applicant within the degree described by
- 14 Subdivision (3);
- 15 (5) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail
- 16 on any ground, an indication of each election for which the
- 17 applicant is applying for a ballot;
- 18 (6) an indication of the ground of eligibility for
- 19 early voting; and
- 20 (7) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail
- 21 on the ground of involuntary civil commitment, the address of the
- 22 facility operated by or under contract with the Texas Civil
- 23 Commitment Office or of a person related to the applicant within the
- 24 degree of consanguinity described by Subdivision (3).
- 25 (d) A person 70 years of age or older may use the number of a
- 26 driver's license or personal identification card that has expired
- 27 for the purpose of fulfilling the requirement under Subsection

- 1 (a)(1-a) if the license or identification is otherwise valid.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 84.011(a), Election Code, as effective
- 3 September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) The officially prescribed application form for an early
- 5 voting ballot must include:
- 6 (1) immediately preceding the signature space the
- 7 statement: "I certify that the information given in this
- 8 application is true, and I understand that giving false information
- 9 in this application is a crime.";
- 10 (2) a statement informing the applicant of the
- offenses prescribed by Sections 84.003 and 84.004;
- 12 (3) spaces for entering an applicant's voter
- 13 registration number and county election precinct of registration,
- 14 with a statement informing the applicant that failure to furnish
- 15 that information does not invalidate the application;
- 16 (3-a) a space for entering the information required
- 17 under Section 84.002(a)(1-a); and
- 18 (4) on an application for a ballot to be voted by mail:
- 19 (A) a space for an applicant applying on the
- 20 ground of absence from the county of residence to indicate the date
- 21 on or after which the applicant can receive mail at the address
- 22 outside the county;
- 23 (B) a space for indicating the fact that an
- 24 applicant whose application is signed by a witness cannot make the
- 25 applicant's mark and a space for indicating the relationship or
- 26 lack of relationship of the witness to the applicant;
- (C) a space for entering an applicant's telephone

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- 1 number, with a statement informing the applicant that failure to
- 2 furnish that information does not invalidate the application;
- 3 (D) a space or box for an applicant applying on
- 4 the ground of age or disability to indicate that the address to
- 5 which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a facility or
- 6 relative described by Section 84.002(a)(3), if applicable;
- 7 (E) a space or box for an applicant applying on
- 8 the ground of confinement in jail or involuntary civil commitment
- 9 to indicate that the address to which the ballot is to be mailed is
- 10 the address of a relative described by Section 84.002(a)(4) or (7),
- 11 if applicable;
- 12 (F) a space for an applicant applying on the
- 13 ground of age or disability to indicate if the application is an
- 14 application under Section 86.0015;
- 15 (G) spaces for entering the signature, printed
- 16 name, and residence address of any person assisting the applicant;
- 17 (H) a statement informing the applicant of the
- 18 condition prescribed by Section 81.005; and
- 19 (I) a statement informing the applicant of the
- 20 requirement prescribed by Section 86.003(c).
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 86.001, Election Code, is amended by
- 22 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 23 <u>(f) If the information required under Section</u>
- 24 84.002(a)(1-a) included on the application does not match the
- 25 information on the applicant's application for voter registration
- 26 under Section 13.002(c)(8), the clerk shall reject the application.
- 27 SECTION 5. Section 86.002, Election Code, is amended by

- 1 adding Subsections (g), (h), and (i) to read as follows:
- 2 <u>(g)</u> The carrier envelope must include a space that is hidden
- 3 from view when the envelope is sealed for the voter to enter the
- 4 following information:
- 5 (1) the number of the voter's driver's license or
- 6 personal identification card issued by the Department of Public
- 7 Safety that has not expired or that expired no earlier than four
- 8 years before the date of presentation; or
- 9 (2) if the voter has not been issued a number described
- 10 by Subdivision (1), the last four digits of the voter's social
- 11 security number.
- 12 (h) A person 70 years of age or older may use the number of a
- 13 <u>driver's license or personal identification card that has expired</u>
- 14 for purposes of Subsection (g) if the license or identification is
- 15 <u>otherwise valid.</u>
- (i) No record associating an individual voter with a ballot
- 17 may be created.
- SECTION 6. Section 87.041(b), Election Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (b) A ballot may be accepted only if:
- 21 (1) the carrier envelope certificate is properly
- 22 executed;
- 23 (2) neither the voter's signature on the ballot
- 24 application nor the signature on the carrier envelope certificate
- 25 is determined to have been executed by a person other than the
- 26 voter, unless signed by a witness;
- 27 (3) the voter's ballot application states a legal

- 1 ground for early voting by mail;
- 2 (4) the voter is registered to vote, if registration
- 3 is required by law;
- 4 (5) the address to which the ballot was mailed to the
- 5 voter, as indicated by the application, was outside the voter's
- 6 county of residence, if the ground for early voting is absence from
- 7 the county of residence;
- 8 (6) for a voter to whom a statement of residence form
- 9 was required to be sent under Section 86.002(a), the statement of
- 10 residence is returned in the carrier envelope and indicates that
- 11 the voter satisfies the residence requirements prescribed by
- 12 Section 63.0011; [and]
- 13 (7) the address to which the ballot was mailed to the
- 14 voter is an address that is otherwise required by Sections 84.002
- 15 and 86.003; and
- 16 (8) the information required under Section 86.002(g)
- 17 provided by the voter matches the information on the voter's
- 18 application for voter registration under Section 13.002(c)(8).
- 19 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 20 an application to vote an early voting ballot by mail submitted on
- 21 or after the effective date of this Act. An application to vote an
- 22 early voting ballot by mail submitted before the effective date of
- 23 this Act is governed by the law in effect when the application was
- 24 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 25 purpose.
- SECTION 8. This Act takes effect December 1, 2021.
