4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 821, Health and Safety Code, is amended
6	by adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER E. UNLAWFUL RESTRAINT OF DOG
8	Sec. 821.101. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Owner" means a person who owns or has custody or
10	control of a dog.

- 11 (2) "Restraint" means a chain, rope, tether, leash,
- 12 cable, or other device that attaches a dog to a stationary object or
- 13 <u>trolley system.</u>
- 14 Sec. 821.102. UNLAWFUL RESTRAINT OF DOG; OFFENSE. (a) An
- 15 owner may not leave a dog outside and unattended by use of a
- 16 restraint.
- 17 (b) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly
- 18 <u>violates</u> this section. The restraint of each dog that is in
- 19 violation of this section is a separate offense.
- 20 <u>(c) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor,</u>
- 21 <u>except that the offense is a Class B misdemeanor if the person has</u>
- 22 previously been convicted under this section.
- 23 (d) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 24 also constitutes an offense under any other law, the actor may be

- 1 prosecuted under this section, the other law, or both.
- 2 Sec. 821.103. EXCEPTIONS. (a) Section 821.102 does not
- 3 apply to:
- 4 (1) the use of a restraint on a dog in a public camping
- 5 or recreational area in compliance with the requirements of the
- 6 public camping or recreational area as defined by a federal, state,
- 7 <u>or local authority or jurisdiction;</u>
- 8 (2) the use of a restraint on a dog while the owner and
- 9 dog engage in, or actively train for, an activity conducted under a
- 10 valid license issued by this state provided:
- 11 (A) the activity is associated with the use or
- 12 presence of a dog; and
- 13 (B) the restraint is used only for the time
- 14 necessary for the owner to complete the activity;
- 15 (3) the use of a restraint on a dog while the owner and
- 16 dog engage in conduct directly related to the business of
- 17 shepherding or herding cattle or livestock provided the restraint
- 18 is used only for the time necessary for the owner to complete the
- 19 shepherding or herding;
- 20 (4) a dog left unattended in an open-air truck bed only
- 21 for the time necessary for the owner to complete a temporary task
- 22 that requires the dog to be left unattended in the truck bed; or
- (5) a dog restrained while the owner and dog are
- 24 engaged in, or actively training for, hunting or field trialing.
- (b) This subchapter does not prohibit a person from walking
- 26 a dog with a handheld leash.
- Sec. 821.104. EFFECT OF SUBCHAPTER ON OTHER LAW. This

- 1 subchapter does not preempt a local regulation relating to the
- 2 restraint of a dog or affect the authority of a political
- 3 subdivision to adopt or enforce an ordinance or requirement
- 4 relating to the restraint of a dog if the regulation, ordinance, or
- 5 requirement relates to an issue not specifically addressed by this
- 6 subchapter.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 821, Health and Safety
- 8 Code, is repealed.
- 9 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 10 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 11 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 12 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 13 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 14 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 15 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 16 before that date.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect January 1, 2022.
