A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the registration of voters at a polling place and
3	related procedures.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 12, Election Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 12.007 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 12.007. CERTAIN ELECTION OFFICERS ARE VOTER
8	REGISTRARS. An election officer serving a polling place for early
9	voting by personal appearance is a deputy voter registrar and has
10	the same authority as a regular deputy registrar.
11	SECTION 2. Chapter 62, Election Code, is amended by adding
12	Section 62.0015 to read as follows:
13	Sec. 62.0015. VOTER REGISTRARS MUST BE PRESENT. Two voter
14	registrars must be present at each polling place while the polls are
15	open.

- SECTION 3. Chapter 63, Election Code, is amended by adding
- 17 Section 63.010 to read as follows:
- Sec. 63.010. REGISTRATION AT POLLING PLACE. (a) A person
- 19 who would be eligible to vote in an election under Section 11.001,
- 20 but for the requirement to be a registered voter, shall be accepted
- 21 during voting by personal appearance for voting the ballot for the
- 22 precinct of the person's residence as shown by the identification
- 23 presented if, on the day the person offers to vote, the person:
- 24 (1) submits a voter registration application that

- 1 complies with Section 13.002 to an election officer at the polling
- 2 place; and
- 3 (2) presents as proof of residence a form of photo
- 4 identification described by Section 63.0101(a) that states the
- 5 person's current address.
- 6 (b) The election officer shall return the original proof of
- 7 residence to the voter.
- 8 (c) A person voting under this section shall vote a
- 9 provisional ballot in the manner provided by Section 63.011 except
- 10 that the person is not required to submit the affidavit under
- 11 Section 63.011(a).
- 12 (d) For each registration corresponding to a ballot cast
- 13 under this section, the voter registrar shall review the
- 14 application and determine whether the applicant is eligible for
- 15 registration as provided by Subchapter C, Chapter 13. A
- 16 registration approved under this subsection takes effect on the
- 17 date the vote was cast.
- 18 (e) The secretary of state may by rule:
- 19 (1) designate additional documents that a person may
- 20 offer to prove the person's residence to register and vote under
- 21 this section; and
- 22 (2) prescribe procedures to implement this section.
- SECTION 4. Section 65.051(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- 25 (a) The early voting ballot board shall verify and count
- 26 provisional ballots as provided by this subchapter not later than
- 27 the 10th [ninth] day after the date of an election.

- 1 SECTION 5. Section 67.003(b), Election Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 (b) Each [Except as provided by Subsection (c), each] local
- 4 canvassing authority shall convene to conduct the local canvass at
- 5 the time set by the canvassing authority's presiding officer not
- 6 later than the 14th [11th] day after election day and not earlier
- 7 than the later of:
- 8 (1) the third day after election day;
- 9 (2) the date on which the early voting ballot board has
- 10 verified and counted all provisional ballots, if a provisional
- 11 ballot has been cast in the election; or
- 12 (3) the date on which all timely received ballots cast
- 13 from addresses outside of the United States are counted, if a ballot
- 14 to be voted by mail in the election was provided to a person outside
- 15 of the United States.
- SECTION 6. Section 85.031(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 (a) For each person entitled to vote an early voting ballot
- 19 by personal appearance or entitled to register at a polling place,
- 20 the early voting clerk shall follow the procedure for accepting or
- 21 <u>registering</u> a regular voter on election day, with the modifications
- 22 necessary for the conduct of early voting.
- SECTION 7. Section 67.003(c), Election Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 8. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 25 last day of the legislative session.
