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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the opportunity to correct a vote by mail application. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 84.011(a), Election Code, as effective 4 5 September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows: 6 (a) The officially prescribed application form for an early voting ballot must include: 7 immediately preceding the signature space the 8 (1) 9 statement: "Ι certify that the information given in this application is true, and I understand that giving false information 10 11 in this application is a crime."; 12 (2) a statement informing the applicant of the 13 offenses prescribed by Sections 84.003 and 84.004; 14 (3) spaces for entering an applicant's voter registration number and county election precinct of registration, 15 16 with a statement informing the applicant that failure to furnish that information does not invalidate the application; and 17 18 (4) on an application for a ballot to be voted by mail: a space for an applicant applying on the 19 (A) ground of absence from the county of residence to indicate the date 20 21 on or after which the applicant can receive mail at the address outside the county; 22 23 (B) a space for indicating the fact that an 24 applicant whose application is signed by a witness cannot make the

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1 applicant's mark and a space for indicating the relationship or
2 lack of relationship of the witness to the applicant;

3 (C) a space for entering an applicant's telephone 4 number <u>and e-mail address</u>, with a statement informing the applicant 5 that failure to furnish that information does not invalidate the 6 application;

7 (D) a space or box for an applicant applying on 8 the ground of age or disability to indicate that the address to 9 which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a facility or 10 relative described by Section 84.002(a)(3), if applicable;

(E) a space or box for an applicant applying on the ground of confinement in jail or involuntary civil commitment in to indicate that the address to which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a relative described by Section 84.002(a)(4) or (7), if applicable;

16 (F) a space for an applicant applying on the 17 ground of age or disability to indicate if the application is an 18 application under Section 86.0015;

19 (G) spaces for entering the signature, printed20 name, and residence address of any person assisting the applicant;

21 (H) a statement informing the applicant of the 22 condition prescribed by Section 81.005; and

(I) a statement informing the applicant of therequirement prescribed by Section 86.003(c).

25 SECTION 2. Section 86.001, Election Code, is amended by 26 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

27 (f) The early voting clerk, before rejecting an application

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on the basis of a clerical error, shall make a reasonable effort to 1 2 contact the applicant by telephone or e-mail at any telephone number or e-mail address provided on the application to notify the 3 applicant of the error. The applicant may appear at the early 4 voting clerk's office to make clerical corrections to the 5 6 application or submit a new application after receiving notice under this section. If the applicant does not appear at the early 7 8 voting clerk's office before the fourth day after the date the early 9 voting clerk contacted the applicant at the telephone number or e-mail address provided on the application, the clerk may reject 10 the application. The early voting clerk shall attach to and 11 maintain with the original application any records created or 12 submitted under this subsection. 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the 14

last day of the legislative session.

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
