A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to foster parent recruitment. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 264.113, Family Code, is amended to read 4 5 as follows: Sec. 264.113. FOSTER PARENT RECRUITMENT. 6 (a) In this 7 section, "faith-based organization" means a religious or denominational institution or 8 organization, including an 9 organization operated for religious, educational, or charitable purposes and operated, supervised, or controlled, in whole or in 10 part, by or in connection with a religious organization. 11 12 (b) The department shall develop a <u>foster parent</u> recruitment program to educate residents of this state about the 13 14 foster care system and the need for foster parents. (b-1) As part of the foster parent recruitment program, the 15 16 department shall recruit and retain foster parents from faith-based organizations. The [As part of the program, the] department shall: 17 18 (1) collaborate with faith-based organizations to inform prospective foster parents about the department's need for 19 20 foster parents, the requirements for becoming a foster parent, and any other aspect of the foster care program that is necessary to 21 recruit foster parents; 22 (2) provide training for prospective foster parents 23 24 recruited under this section; and

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(3) identify and recommend ways in which faith-based
organizations may support persons as they are recruited, are
trained, and serve as foster parents.

4 (c) The department shall work with OneStar Foundation to 5 expand the foster parent recruitment program [described by Subsection (b)] to increase the number of foster families available 6 7 for the department and its private providers. In cooperation with 8 the department, OneStar Foundation may provide training and 9 technical assistance to establish networks and services in faith-based organizations based on best practices for supporting 10 prospective and current foster families. 11

12 (d) The department shall work with the <u>Health and Human</u> 13 <u>Services Commission</u> [Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative 14 <u>Services</u>] to recruit foster parents and adoptive parents who have 15 skills, training, or experience suitable to care for children with 16 hearing impairments.

17 (e) The department shall collaborate with foster and 18 adoptive parents to develop and implement a foster parent 19 recruitment plan. The plan must:

20 <u>(1) identify geographic areas in this state in need of</u> 21 <u>foster parents using risk stratification modeling or risk</u> 22 <u>assessments of geographic areas with higher occurrences of child</u> 23 <u>abuse and neglect or child fatalities;</u>

24 (2) use data analysis, social media, partnerships with 25 <u>faith-based and volunteer organizations</u>, and other recruitment 26 <u>strategies</u>, including targeted and child-focused recruitment;

27 (3) identify the number of available foster parents

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1	for children with increased needs for therapy or treatment in order
2	to expand the use of therapeutic or treatment foster care for
3	children in those placements;
4	(4) require the provision of:
5	(A) quality customer service to prospective
6	foster and adoptive parents and to foster and adoptive parents; and
7	(B) assistance to prospective foster parents
8	with the certification and placement process;
9	(5) include strategies for increasing the number of
10	kinship providers;
11	(6) include strategies to ensure that children in
12	foster care are not required to transfer schools after entering
13	foster care, unless transferring is in the child's best interest;
14	and
15	(7) include programs to support foster and adoptive
16	families, including programs that provide training, respite care,
17	and peer assistance.
18	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
19	last day of the legislative session.

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
