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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Lake Houston Dredging and Maintenance District; providing the authority to issue bonds; 3 providing authority to impose assessments and fees. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Subtitle L, Title 6, Special District Local Laws 7 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 9602 to read as follows: CHAPTER 9602. LAKE HOUSTON DREDGING AND MAINTENANCE DISTRICT 8 9 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS Sec. 9602.0101. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 10 11 (1) "Board" means the board of directors of the 12 district. (2) "Director" means a member of the board of 13 directors of the district. 14 (3) "District" means the Lake Houston Dredging and 15 16 Maintenance District. Sec. 9602.0102. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a 17 conservation and reclamation district created under and essential 18 to accomplish the purposes of Section 59, Article XVI, Texas 19 Constitution. 20 21 Sec. 9602.0103. FINDINGS OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE. (a) The district is created to serve a public use and benefit. 22 23 (b) All land and other property in the boundaries of the district will benefit from the works and projects accomplished by 24

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the district under the powers conferred by Section 59, Article XVI, 1 2 Texas Constitution. Sec. 9602.0104. DISTRICT TERRITORY. Unless the district 3 territory has been modified under Subchapter J, Chapter 49, Water 4 5 Code, or other law, the boundaries of the district are coextensive with the boundaries of Harris County. 6 7 SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS 8 Sec. 9602.0201. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is governed by a board of directors appointed as follows: 9 10 (1) three directors appointed by the Harris County 11 Commissioners Court; 12 (2) three directors appointed by the city council of 13 the City of Houston; and 14 (3) the board's presiding officer, appointed jointly 15 by the county judge of Harris County and the mayor of the City of 16 Houston. 17 (b) Directors serve staggered four-year terms. SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES 18 Sec. 9602.0301. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. Except as 19 provided by this chapter, the district has the powers and duties 20 applicable to a district under Chapter 49, Water Code. 21 Sec. 9602.0302. SPECIFIC POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) In this 22 section, "dredging and maintenance operations" includes the 23 24 removal of: 25 (1) sediment and debris that accumulates under and 26 above the water; and (2) floating debris. 27

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1	(b) The district may form voluntary interlocal agreements
2	with political subdivisions, corporate entities, or other persons
3	to perform dredging and maintenance operations in areas on Lake
4	Houston and its tributaries located within the district controlled
5	or maintained by the party to the interlocal agreement. The
6	district may require payment from the other party to the interlocal
7	agreement for dredging and maintenance operations performed under
8	an interlocal agreement entered into under this section.
9	(c) The district may seek from any source a grant of money or
10	another resource to assist the district's dredging and maintenance
11	operations.
12	(d) Dredging and maintenance operations performed by or
13	caused to be performed by the district may not:
14	(1) negatively affect the quality of water in Lake
15	Houston; or
16	(2) degrade the quality of water to be treated by the
17	City of Houston's Northeast Water Purification Plant.
18	(e) The district must obtain approval before performing
19	dredging and maintenance operations in Lake Houston from the City
20	of Houston Public WorksEngineering Department.
21	Sec. 9602.0303. SAND, GRAVEL, MARL, SHELL, AND MUDSHELL.
22	(a) Notwithstanding any other law, the district may take sand,
23	gravel, marl, shell, and mudshell from Lake Houston and its
24	tributaries to restore, maintain, or expand the capacity of the
25	lake and its tributaries to convey storm flows.
26	(b) For purposes of this section, the district is not
27	required to:

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1	(1) obtain a permit or pay a fee to take sand, gravel,
2	marl, shell, or mudshell under Subsection (a); or
3	(2) purchase sand, gravel, marl, shell, or mudshell
4	taken under Subsection (a).
5	(c) The district may:
6	(1) deposit sand, gravel, marl, shell, or mudshell
7	taken under Subsection (a) on private land; and
8	(2) sell sand, gravel, marl, shell, or mudshell taken
9	under Subsection (a).
10	Sec. 9602.0304. LIMITATION ON POWERS. The district may
11	<u>not:</u>
12	(1) finance, develop, or maintain a recreational
13	facility under Subchapter N, Chapter 49, Water Code;
14	(2) exercise the power of eminent domain; or
15	(3) perform the same function as another conservation
16	and reclamation district whose territory overlaps with the
17	territory of the district, except the district may perform dredging
18	operations if other conservation and reclamation districts are
19	performing dredging operations in the territory of the district.
20	SUBCHAPTER D. FINANCIAL PROVISIONS
21	Sec. 9602.0401. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE REVENUE BONDS. (a) The
22	district may issue bonds payable from and secured by district
23	revenue to carry out any power conferred by this chapter. The bonds
24	must be authorized by a board resolution.
25	(b) The bonds must be issued in the manner and under the
26	terms of the resolution authorizing the issuance of the bonds.
27	Sec. 9602.0402. PLAN OF FINANCING. (a) The district shall

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1 study methods of financing the services provided by and 2 improvements constructed by the district.

3 (b) The district shall make the results of the study 4 conducted under this section available to the public.

5 <u>Sec. 9602.0403. PROHIBITION ON TAXATION AND CERTAIN FEES.</u>
6 (a) The district may not impose an ad valorem tax.

7 (b) Except as provided by Section 9602.0302, the district 8 may not charge a fee.

9 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than September 1, 2022, the Harris 10 County Commissioners Court, the city council of the City of 11 Houston, the county judge of Harris County, and the mayor of the 12 City of Houston shall appoint the initial members of the board of 13 the Lake Houston Dredging and Maintenance District as required by 14 Section 9602.0201, Special District Local Laws Code, as added by 15 this Act.

16 (b) At the first meeting of the board of directors of the 17 Lake Houston Dredging and Maintenance District, the directors shall 18 draw lots to determine which four directors serve a term of four 19 years and which three directors serve a term of two years.

20 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to 21 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this 22 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 23 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 24 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished 25 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, 26 Government Code.

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(b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has

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submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
 Environmental Quality.

3 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 4 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the 5 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of 6 representatives within the required time.

7 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this 8 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect 9 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled 10 and accomplished.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.
