## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT	
2	relating to acceptable forms of identification for voting.	

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 63.0101(a), Election Code, is amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 The following documentation is an acceptable form of photo identification under this chapter: 7
- (1) a driver's license, election identification 8 certificate, or personal identification card issued to the voter 9 [person] by the Department of Public Safety that has not expired or 10 11 that expired no earlier than four years before the date of
- 12 presentation;

- 13 (2) a United States military identification card that 14 contains the voter's [person's] photograph that has not expired or that expired no earlier than four years before the date of 15 16 presentation;
- 17 (3) a United States citizenship certificate issued to the voter [person] that contains the voter's [person's] photograph; 18
- (4) a United States passport book or card issued to the 19 20 voter [person] that has not expired or that expired no earlier than
- 21 four years before the date of presentation; [or]
- 22 (5) a license to carry a handgun issued to the voter [person] by the Department of Public Safety that has not expired or 23
- 24 that expired no earlier than four years before the date of

- 1 presentation;
- 2 (6) an official Native American identification card or
- 3 tribal document that:
- 4 (A) contains the voter's photograph and address;
- 5 <u>and</u>
- 6 (B) is issued by a tribal organization or by a
- 7 tribe that is federally recognized and located in this state;
- 8 (7) an identification card issued by a public or
- 9 private institution of higher education located in this state that
- 10 contains the voter's photograph; or
- 11 (8) an identification card issued by a state agency of
- 12 this state that contains the voter's photograph.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 18 legislative session.
