A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to providing accelerated instruction for public school
- 3 students who fail to achieve satisfactory performance on certain
- 4 assessment instruments.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 28.0211, Education Code, as amended by
- 7 H.B. No. 4545, Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021,
- 8 is amended by amending Subsections (a-1), (a-4), and (f-4) and
- 9 adding Subsection (q) to read as follows:
- 10 (a-1) Each time a student fails to perform satisfactorily on
- 11 a mathematics or reading [an] assessment instrument administered
- 12 under Section 39.023(a) in the third, fourth, fifth, sixth,
- 13 seventh, or eighth grade, the school district in which the student
- 14 attends school shall provide to the student accelerated instruction
- 15 in the applicable subject area during the subsequent summer or
- 16 school year and either:
- 17 (1) allow the student to be assigned a classroom
- 18 teacher who is certified as a master, exemplary, or recognized
- 19 teacher under Section 21.3521 for the subsequent school year in the
- 20 applicable subject area; or
- 21 (2) provide the student supplemental instruction
- 22 under Subsection (a-4).
- 23 (a-4) If a district receives funding under Section 29.0881,
- 24 the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations

- 1 Act, 2021 (Div. M, Pub. L. No. 116-260), or the American Rescue Plan
- 2 Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2), then supplemental instruction
- 3 provided by a school district under Subsection (a-1)(2) must:
- 4 (1) include targeted instruction in the essential
- 5 knowledge and skills for the applicable grade levels and subject
- 6 area;
- 7 (2) be provided in addition to instruction normally
- 8 provided to students in the grade level in which the student is
- 9 enrolled;
- 10 (3) be provided for no less than 30 total hours during
- 11 the subsequent summer or school year and, unless the instruction is
- 12 provided fully during summer, include instruction no less than once
- 13 per week during the school year;
- 14 (4) be designed to assist the student in achieving
- 15 satisfactory performance in the applicable grade level and subject
- 16 area;
- 17 (5) include effective instructional materials
- 18 designed for supplemental instruction;
- 19 (6) be provided to a student individually or in a group
- 20 of no more than 10 [three] students, unless the parent or guardian
- 21 of each student in the group authorizes a larger group;
- 22 (7) be provided by a person with training in the
- 23 applicable instructional materials for the supplemental
- 24 instruction and under the oversight of the school district; and
- 25 (8) to the extent possible, be provided by one person
- 26 for the entirety of the student's supplemental instruction period.
- 27 (f-4) If a student who fails to perform satisfactorily on an

- 1 assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) fails [in the
- 2 subsequent school year] to perform satisfactorily on an assessment
- 3 instrument in the same subject on two subsequent consecutive
- 4 attempts, the superintendent of the district, or the
- 5 superintendent's designee, shall meet with the student's
- 6 accelerated learning committee to:
- 7 (1) identify the reason the student did not perform
- 8 satisfactorily; and
- 9 (2) determine, in order to ensure the student performs
- 10 satisfactorily on the assessment instrument at the next
- 11 administration of the assessment instrument, whether:
- 12 (A) the educational plan developed for the
- 13 student under Subsection (f) must be modified to provide the
- 14 necessary accelerated instruction for that student; and
- 15 (B) any additional resources are required for
- 16 that student.
- 17 (q) The commissioner may waive for one year the requirements
- 18 under this section regarding accelerated learning committees and
- 19 accelerated instruction for a school district in which at least 60
- 20 percent of the students who received accelerated instruction during
- 21 the school year preceding the previous school year performed
- 22 satisfactorily in the subsequent school year on the assessment
- 23 instrument in each subject in which the student previously failed
- 24 to perform satisfactorily. Not later than the beginning of each
- 25 school year, the commissioner shall publish a list of school
- 26 districts that qualify for a waiver under this subsection.
- 27 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2022-2023

- 1 school year.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 7 legislative session.
