WHEREAS, The Alabama-Coushatta Tribe of Texas lost an admired
leader with the passing of Principal Chief Herbert G. Johnson Sr. on
August 9, 2021, at the age of 79; and

WHEREAS, A member of the Beaver Clan, Herbert Johnson was 4 born on April 3, 1942, on the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation 5 near Livingston; after graduating from high school, he studied at 6 7 Jacksonville College, where he enjoyed a successful basketball career; among his many achievements, he earned All-American 8 9 recognition in 1963, and he was later honored by the college as a Distinguished Alumnus; he also briefly attended the University of 10 11 Houston, and he went on to obtain certification from Kilgore 12 College and the Angelina Criminal Justice Center as an East Texas Police Academy reserve officer; and 13

14 WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson served two terms the on Alabama-Coushatta Tribal Council and worked as the tribal security 15 director for more than two decades before his retirement in 2012; 16 the following year, he was elected as the tribe's second chief, and 17 he held that position until January 1, 2020, when he was installed 18 as principal chief, or Mikko Choba Skalaaba; along the way, he 19 served with the tribe's volunteer fire department and managed 20 21 tribal softball and basketball leagues, and he was a member of the Big Sandy Independent School District Board of Trustees for 48 22 23 years; a man of deep faith, he was also a deacon and elder of the 24 Indian Presbyterian Church; and

11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas 12 Legislature, 2nd Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the memory 13 of Principal Chief Herbert G. Johnson Sr. and extend deepest 14 sympathy to all who mourn his passing; and, be it further
