University, and after earning his law degree from The University of 8

School in 1952; he went on to study economics at Stanford

and to serve as trustee of the estate of his grandfather, Joseph 10

14 WHEREAS, Deeply committed to promoting the arts and education across the Panhandle area, Mr. Pool gave generously to a host of 15 16 causes; he was integral to the development of Ascension Academy, and many other organizations and institutions also benefited from 17 his involvement, including the Globe-News Center Performance Hall, 18 Amarillo Botanical Gardens, Amarillo College, Amarillo Little 19 Theatre, Amarillo Museum of Art, Amarillo Opera, Boy Scouts of 20 21 America Golden Spread Council, First Christian Church, Lone Star Ballet, Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum, St. Hyacinth Church, 22 23 Texas Panhandle Heritage Foundation, and West Texas A&M University;

- 1 WHEREAS, A man of many interests, Mr. Pool held a deep
- 2 passion for history and artifacts; he loved to visit places of
- 3 historical significance, and one highlight of his travels was
- 4 planting a Texas flag at the North Pole; in addition, he was a
- 5 natural at roping cattle and especially enjoyed riding on horseback
- 6 throughout the Sneed Ranch in search of Native American relics and
- 7 cavalry memorabilia; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Pool and his first wife, Marilyn Myers, were
- 9 blessed with three children, Pam, Tory, and Marci; he later married
- 10 the former Arlene Veneras Gall, with whom he shared his life for
- 11 more than 35 years until her passing on June 4, 2019; through the
- 12 years, Mr. Pool had the pleasure of seeing his family grow to
- 13 include six grandchildren, Michelle, Lacey, Rey, Christina,
- 14 Tanner, and Stanton, and six great-grandchildren, Aiden, Brandon,
- 15 Lucio, Roman, Troy, and Maddox; and
- WHEREAS, Admired for his dry wit, big heart, and humble
- 17 spirit, Joe Pool leaves behind a legacy that will long be treasured
- 18 by all those who held him dear; now, therefore, be it
