RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The right to vote is sacred and the exercise of that
- 2 right represents a cornerstone of our democracy; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The offense of illegal voting has long existed in
- 4 this state, and when first codified, stated that if "any person,
- 5 knowing himself not to be a qualified voter" nonetheless voted, the
- 6 person would be subject to a fine; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The offense has changed over the decades until its
- 8 eventual recodification in Section 64.012(a)(1), Election Code,
- 9 which states that a person commits the offense if the person "votes
- 10 or attempts to vote in an election in which the person knows the
- 11 person is not eligible to vote"; and
- WHEREAS, The offense is punishable by incarceration, fine, or
- 13 both, and
- 14 WHEREAS, A person's knowledge of their own ineligibility has
- 15 always been an element of the offense; and
- 16 WHEREAS, It is a fundamental principle of criminal law in
- 17 this state that persons should only be convicted of an offense when
- 18 all required elements of the offense are shown to have been
- 19 satisfied; and
- WHEREAS, Instances where a person knows that the person is
- 21 ineligible to vote in an election, but nonetheless votes or
- 22 attempts to vote should be prosecuted; and
- WHEREAS, Cases of genuine mistake, where the person votes or
- 24 attempts to vote under the honest belief that the person is eligible

- 1 to vote, should not establish the required element of knowledge of
- 2 one's own ineligibility; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In such cases, the ineligible person's vote should
- 4 not be allowed, and any vote erroneously cast by an ineligible
- 5 person should not be counted, but a person should not be criminally
- 6 incarcerated for making an innocent mistake; now, therefore, be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas
- 8 Legislature, 2nd Called Session, hereby strongly believes that no
- 9 Texan should be prosecuted for the offense of illegal voting if the
- 10 person voted or attempted to vote based on a mistaken, honest belief
- 11 that the person was in fact eligible to vote; and, be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Texas House of Representatives encourages
- 13 the careful exercise of discretion at all levels of government when
- 14 investigating and prosecuting cases of alleged illegal voting.
