A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the management of polling place locations during a
3	continuous period for voting.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 41, Election Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 41.0015 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 41.0015. ELECTION PERIOD. In this title, "election
8	period" means the period beginning on the first day of early voting
9	by personal appearance as described under Section 85.001 and ending
10	when the polls close on election day.
11	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 43, Election Code, is
12	amended by adding Section 43.008 to read as follows:
13	Sec. 43.008. ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACES DURING ELECTION
14	PERIOD. If the county clerk or commissioners court, as applicable,
15	determines that more polling places are needed during the election
16	period than the number initially opened, the county clerk or
17	commissioners court may open more polling places, but may not, for
18	any reason, close a polling place before the end of the election
19	period.
20	SECTION 3. Section 61.002, Election Code, is amended to
21	read as follows:
22	Sec. 61.002. OPENING AND CLOSING POLLING PLACE FOR VOTING.
23	(a) Immediately before opening the polls for voting on the first day
24	of the election period, the presiding election judge shall confirm

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1	that each voting machine has any public counter reset to zero and
2	shall print the zero tape:
3	(1) that shows the counter was set to zero; and
4	(2) that shows the summary for each candidate and
5	measure on the ballot for each voting machine is set to zero.
6	(b) At the official time for opening the polls for voting,
7	an election officer shall open the polling place entrance and admit
8	the voters.
9	(c) Immediately after closing the polls for voting on the
10	last day of the election period, the presiding election judge shall
11	print the results tape to show the summary of votes for each
12	candidate or ballot measure for each voting machine at that polling
13	location.
14	(d) The precinct election judge, and an election official
15	aligned with a different political party, shall sign a tape printed
16	under this section.
17	(e) In this section, "election period" has the meaning
18	assigned by Section 41.0015.
19	SECTION 4. Sections 85.001(a) and (e), Election Code, are
20	amended to read as follows:
21	(a) The period for early voting by personal appearance
22	begins on the 14 th $[17$ th] day before election day and continues
23	through <u>the opening of the polls on</u> [the fourth day before] election
24	day, except as otherwise provided by this section.
25	(e) For an election held on the uniform election date in May
26	and any resulting runoff election, the period for early voting by
27	personal appearance begins on the $10 ext{th}$ [$12 ext{th}$] day before election

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day and continues through the opening of the polls on [the fourth
day before] election day.

3 SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 125, Election Code, is 4 amended by adding Section 125.0635 to read as follows:

Sec. 125.0635. SECURING EQUIPMENT ON FAILURE OF EQUIPMENT.
(a) In this section, "election period" has the meaning assigned by
Section 41.0015.

8 (b) If a piece of electronic voting machine equipment fails 9 and is taken out of service during the election period, the 10 equipment and any associated memory card must be securely isolated 11 until the end of the election period.

12 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 16 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the 17 legislative session.

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
