2	relating to qualifications and registration of certain voters
3	convicted of a felony.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 11.002(a), Election Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) In this code, "qualified voter" means a person who:
8	(1) is 18 years of age or older;
9	(2) is a United States citizen;
10	(3) has not been determined by a final judgment of a
11	court exercising probate jurisdiction to be:
12	(A) totally mentally incapacitated; or
13	(B) partially mentally incapacitated without the
14	right to vote;
15	(4) has not been finally convicted of a felony or, if
16	so convicted, <u>is not currently incarcerated for that offense</u> [has:
17	[(A) fully discharged the person's sentence,
18	including any term of incarceration, parole, or supervision, or
19	completed a period of probation ordered by any court; or
20	(B) been pardoned or otherwise released from the
21	<pre>resulting disability to vote];</pre>
22	(5) is a resident of this state; and
23	(6) is a registered voter.
24	SECTION 2. Section 13.001(a), Election Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (a) To be eligible for registration as a voter in this
- 3 state, a person must:
- 4 (1) be 18 years of age or older;
- 5 (2) be a United States citizen;
- 6 (3) not have been determined by a final judgment of a
- 7 court exercising probate jurisdiction to be:
- 8 (A) totally mentally incapacitated; or
- 9 (B) partially mentally incapacitated without the
- 10 right to vote;
- 11 (4) not have been finally convicted of a felony or, if
- 12 so convicted, must not currently be incarcerated for that offense
- 13 [have:
- 14 [(A) fully discharged the person's sentence,
- 15 including any term of incarceration, parole, or supervision, or
- 16 completed a period of probation ordered by any court; or
- 17 [(B) been pardoned or otherwise released from the
- 18 resulting disability to vote]; and
- 19 (5) be a resident of the county in which application
- 20 for registration is made.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 26 legislative session.
