4	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 321, Business & Commerce
5	Code, is amended to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 321. REGULATION OF [CERTAIN] ELECTRONIC MAIL
7	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 321, Business & Commerce
8	Code, is amended by adding Section 321.054 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 321.054. IMPEDING ELECTRONIC MAIL MESSAGES
10	PROHIBITED. An electronic mail service provider may not
11	intentionally impede the transmission of another person's
12	electronic mail message based on content unless:
13	(1) the provider is authorized to block the
14	transmission under Section 321.114; or
15	(2) the message contains a computer virus, as defined
16	by Section 33.01, Penal Code, obscene material, material depicting
17	sexual conduct, or material that violates other law.
18	SECTION 3. Section 321.105(a), Business & Commerce Code, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	(a) In lieu of actual damages, a person injured by a
21	violation of this chapter arising from the transmission of an
22	unsolicited or commercial electronic mail message or by a violation
23	of Section 321.054 may recover an amount equal to the lesser of:
24	(1) \$10 for each unlawful message <u>or each message</u>

1 <u>unlawfully impeded</u>, as applicable; or

2 (2) \$25,000 for each day the unlawful message is
3 received <u>or the message is unlawfully impeded, as applicable</u>.

4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the 5 last day of the legislative session.
