FLOOR AMENDMENT NO.\_\_\_\_\_ By: Minjarez

1 Amend C.S.S.B. No. 8 (house committee printing) by adding the

2 following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and

renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

4 SECTION \_\_\_\_. PROGRAM OF ALL-INCLUSIVE CARE FOR THE ELDERLY

5 (PACE). (a) Notwithstanding Rider 122, page II-85, Chapter 1053

6 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the

General Appropriations Act), the Health and Human Services

8 Commission shall transfer money from Strategy A.1.1., Aged and

9 Medicare-Related, or Strategy A.1.2., Disability-Related, to

10 Strategy A.3.5., All-Inclusive Care - Elderly (PACE), as listed in

11 that Act, in an amount not to exceed \$2,807,303 in general revenue

12 funds appropriated for the state fiscal year beginning September 1,

13 2021, and \$11,229,210 in general revenue funds appropriated for the

14 state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2022, to support up to 150

15 clients served in each of up to two additional Program of

16 All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) sites. The amount

17 transferred under this subsection may not exceed \$1,403,651 for the

18 state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2021, and \$5,614,605 for

19 the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2022, for each new

20 site. It is the intent of the legislature that additional PACE sites

21 be located in Bexar County and administered by entities with

22 available facility space and demonstrated administrative capacity.

23 The new sites shall support the goals of increased access to

24 healthcare services, options for eligible persons, and improved

25 public health outcomes.

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26 (b) The transfer of money described by Subsection (a) of

27 this section is contingent on the additional PACE sites having:

28 (1) complied with the statutory requirements of

29 Section 32.053, Human Resources Code, and any regulatory

- 1 requirements; and
- 2 (2) been approved by the Centers for Medicare and
- 3 Medicaid Services to be a provider agency.
- 4 (c) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 5 Services Commission shall provide written notice to the Legislative
- 6 Budget Board and the governor of the certification and transfer
- 7 amounts not later than the 30th business day after the date a
- 8 transfer occurs.
- 9 (d) If transfer authority provided by Subsection (a) of this
- 10 section is not sufficient to serve the increase in clients
- 11 described by Subsection (a) of this section, the executive
- 12 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 13 submit a written request to the Legislative Budget Board and the
- 14 governor for approval to transfer additional money from the
- 15 strategies described by Subsection (a) of this section. The
- 16 request shall be considered approved unless the Legislative Budget
- 17 Board or the governor issues a written disapproval not later than
- 18 the 30th business day after the date the staff of the Legislative
- 19 Budget Board concludes its review of the request and forwards its
- 20 review to the chair of the house appropriations committee, chair of
- 21 the senate finance committee, speaker of the house of
- 22 representatives, and lieutenant governor. Any requests for
- 23 additional information made by the Legislative Budget Board toll
- 24 the counting of the 30 business days.
- (e) Proposed rates related to all PACE sites, including any
- 26 new sites as authorized by this section, are subject to the
- 27 requirements in Section 12, page II-102, Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1),
- 28 Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General
- 29 Appropriations Act). The fiscal impact of proposed rates shall be
- 30 calculated relative to the average cost per client for existing
- 31 PACE sites.

- 1 (f) A PACE provider shall provide any requested information
- 2 on actual cost, caseload, and service on request of the Health and
- 3 Human Services Commission, the Legislative Budget Board, or the
- 4 governor.
