A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to prohibited COVID-19 vaccine passports; providing a
- 3 civil penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 161.0085, Health and
- 6 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 161.0085. COVID-19 VACCINE PASSPORTS PROHIBITED;
- 8 CIVIL PENALTY.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 161.0085, Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended by amending Subsections (c), (d), and (e) and adding
- 11 Subsections (c-1) and (f) to read as follows:
- 12 (c) A business in this state may not require a customer or an
- 13 employee of the business to provide any documentation certifying
- 14 the customer's or employee's COVID-19 vaccination or
- 15 post-transmission recovery on entry to, to gain access to, [ex] to
- 16 receive service from, or to be employed by the business. A business
- 17 that fails to comply with this subsection is not eligible to receive
- 18 a grant or enter into a contract payable with state funds.
- 19 (c-1) A public or private primary or secondary school in
- 20 this state may not require a student to provide documentation
- 21 certifying the student's COVID-19 vaccination or post-transmission
- 22 recovery for entry or admission to the school. A public or private
- 23 primary or secondary school in this state that fails to comply with
- 24 this subsection is not eligible to receive a grant or enter into a

- 1 contract payable with state funds.
- 2 (d) Notwithstanding any other law, each appropriate state
- 3 agency shall ensure that businesses in this state comply with
- 4 Subsection (c) and [may] require compliance with that subsection as
- 5 a condition for a license, permit, or other state authorization
- 6 necessary for conducting business in this state.
- 7 (e) This section may not be construed to:
- 8 (1) restrict a business or public or private primary
- 9 or secondary school from implementing COVID-19 screening and
- 10 infection control protocols for customers or students, as
- 11 applicable, in accordance with authoritative or controlling
- 12 government-issued guidance [state and federal law] to protect
- 13 public health; or
- 14 (2) interfere with an individual's right to access the
- 15 individual's personal health information under federal law.
- (f) A governmental entity, business, or public or private
- 17 primary or secondary school that violates this section is liable to
- 18 this state for a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 for
- 19 <u>each violation. The at</u>torney general may bring an action to collect
- 20 the civil penalty imposed under this subsection.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 161.0085, Health and Safety Code, as
- 22 amended by this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after
- 23 the effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the
- 24 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 25 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former
- 26 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect February 1, 2022.
