- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to a covenant not to compete that is ancillary to or part of an
- 6 agreement entered into on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 7 A covenant not to compete that is ancillary to or part of an
- 8 agreement entered into before the effective date of this Act is
- 9 governed by the law in effect at the time the agreement was entered
- 10 into, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 12 last day of the legislative session.
