1	AN ACT
2	relating to the employment and licensing of border security
3	officers employed by the Department of Public Safety; making an
4	appropriation.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 411.02091 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 411.02091. BORDER SECURITY OFFICERS. (a) The
9	department may employ as a border security officer to assist
10	department efforts along the Texas-Mexico border an individual who:
11	(1) has served in the United States armed forces and
12	received a discharge because the individual refused to be
13	vaccinated against COVID-19; and
14	(2) holds a border security officer license issued by
15	the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.
16	(b) The department shall develop for border security
17	officers a training program that complies with the requirements of
18	Subchapter P, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code.
19	SECTION 2. Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is amended by
20	adding Subchapter P to read as follows:
21	SUBCHAPTER P. BORDER SECURITY OFFICERS
22	Sec. 1701.751. BORDER SECURITY OFFICER LICENSE. (a) The
23	commission shall adopt rules establishing a border security officer
24	license for border security officers of the Department of Public

- 2 (b) The rules adopted under Subsection (a) must provide for
- 3 an application process for a border security officer license that
- 4 is similar to the application process for a peace officer license.
- 5 Sec. 1701.752. ELIGIBILITY. A border security officer
- 6 license may be issued only to an individual who:
- 7 (1) served in the United States armed forces and
- 8 received a discharge because the individual refused to be
- 9 vaccinated against COVID-19; and
- 10 (2) satisfies the eligibility requirements
- 11 <u>established by commission rule.</u>
- 12 Sec. 1701.753. REQUIRED TRAINING. The commission, in
- 13 consultation with the Department of Public Safety, shall establish
- 14 training requirements for border security officers.
- Sec. 1701.754. AUTHORITY OF BORDER SECURITY OFFICER. (a)
- 16 An individual who holds a border security officer license has the
- 17 same authority as a peace officer except as otherwise provided by
- 18 commission rule.
- 19 (b) The commission, in consultation with the Department of
- 20 Public Safety, shall adopt rules to implement this section.
- 21 SECTION 3. The amount of \$1 billion is appropriated from the
- 22 general revenue fund to the Department of Public Safety of the State
- 23 of Texas for the purpose of providing salaries to border security
- 24 officers employed by the department during the two-year period
- 25 beginning on the effective date of this Act.
- 26 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 4 legislative session.
