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## RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE House of Representatives of the State of Texas, that House Rule 13, Section 9, be suspended in part as provided by House Rule 13, Section 9(f) to enable consideration of, and action on, the following specific matters which may be contained in the Conference Committee Report on Senate Bill 8.

A. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9a (4) to allow the Conference
Committee to add text on any matter which is not included in either
8 the House or Senate version of the bill to read as follows:

SECTION 4. DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES: COVID-19 9 SERVICES. (a) The amount of \$2,000,000,000 is appropriated to the 10 11 Department of State Health Services from money received by this 12 state from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 13 14 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and deposited to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief Fund No. 325 during the period beginning on the effective 15 date of this Act and ending January 1, 2023, for the following 16 purposes related to costs incurred during the period beginning 17 March 3, 2021, and ending January 1, 2023, due to the coronavirus 18 disease pandemic: 19

(1) providing funding for surge staffing at state and
 local hospitals, long-term care facilities, psychiatric hospitals,
 and nursing facilities;

(2) purchasing therapeutic drugs, including drugs for
 monoclonal antibody treatments; and

H.R. No. 297 1 (3) providing funding for the operation of regional 2 infusion centers.

Notwithstanding Section 13.05, page IX-64, Chapter 1053 3 (b) (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the 4 5 General Appropriations Act), the Department of State Health Services shall expend any Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Funds 6 freed-up as a result of reimbursements received by the Department 7 8 of State Health Services from the Federal Emergency Management Agency related to expenditures paid from money appropriated under 9 Subsection (a) of this section only after prior approval of the 10 Legislative Budget Board. 11

B. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9a (4) to allow the Conference Committee to add text on any matter which is not included in either the House or Senate version of the bill to read as follows:

15 SECTION 6. DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE: COMPENSATION. (a) The amount of \$359,673,191 is appropriated to the Department of 16 17 Criminal Justice from money received by this state from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) 18 established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. 19 No. 117-2) and deposited to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief 20 Fund No. 325 for the purpose of providing compensation for agency 21 employees for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2021. 22

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(b) The Department of Criminal Justice shall:

(1) in consultation with the comptroller of public
accounts and the Legislative Budget Board, determine the proper
allocation of benefits included in the appropriations made under
Subsection (a) of this section; and

1 (2) identify the strategies and objectives for which 2 the appropriations made under Subsection (a) of this section are 3 directed.

4 (c) It is the intent of the legislature that the Department 5 of Criminal Justice consider the appropriations as a change in the 6 method of finance of the compensation to be paid to agency employees 7 and not as an increase in total appropriations to the agency.

8 C. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9a (4) to allow the Conference
9 Committee to add text on any matter which is not included in either
10 the House or Senate version of the bill to read as follows:

SECTION 8. HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD: 11 TEXAS CHILD MENTAL HEALTH CARE CONSORTIUM. (a) 12 The amount of \$113,082,887 is appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating 13 14 Board from money received by this state from the Coronavirus State 15 Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and deposited 16 17 to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief Fund No. 325 for the purpose of supporting the operations and expansion of the Texas Child 18 Mental Health Care Consortium to expand mental health initiatives 19 for children, pregnant women, and women who are up to one year 20 postpartum during the two-year period beginning on the effective 21 22 date of this Act. At the direction of the Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium, the Higher Education Coordinating Board shall 23 24 transfer appropriations through interagency contracts with health-related institutions of higher education for the following 25 26 purposes:

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(1) \$20,578,442 for enhancements and expansion of the

1 Child Psychiatry Access Network;

2 (2) \$56,218,976 for enhancements and expansion of the
3 Texas Child Access Through Telemedicine program;

4 (3) \$32,991,791 for expansion of the child and 5 adolescent mental health workforce; and

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(4) \$3,293,676 for administrative expenses.

7 (b) Not later than December 1, 2021, out of money 8 appropriated by Subsection (a) of this section, the Higher Education Coordinating Board shall transfer \$3,293,676 to an 9 10 institution of higher education designated by the Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium for oversight and evaluation of the 11 12 outlined initiatives by means of interagency agreements or any other necessary contracts. 13

The Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium may 14 (c) transfer up to 10 percent of money appropriated for the purposes 15 described by Subsection (a)(1), (2), or (3) of this section to any 16 17 of the other purposes described by those provisions. The Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium may transfer more than 10 18 19 percent of funds for those purposes only with the prior approval for the transfer and expenditure from the Legislative Budget Board. A 20 request for approval of the transfer and expenditure by the 21 consortium is considered approved unless the Legislative Budget 22 23 Board issues a written disapproval within 10 business days of the 24 receipt and review of the request by the Legislative Budget Board.

(d) Out of money appropriated by Subsection (a) of this section, the Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium may enhance the Child Psychiatry Access Network to improve perinatal mental

1 health services.

2 D. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9a (4) to allow the Conference
3 Committee to add text on any matter which is not included in either
4 the House or Senate version of the bill to read as follows:

SECTION 10. HIGHER 5 EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD: UNIVERSITY CONSTRUCTION. (a) Contingent on legislation by the 6 87th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2021, relating to 7 the 8 issuance of tuition revenue bonds, becoming law, the amount of \$325,000,000 is appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating 9 Board from money received by this state from the Coronavirus State 10 Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established under the 11 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and deposited 12 to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief Fund No. 325 for the purpose 13 14 of university construction during the two-year period beginning on 15 the effective date of this Act.

(b) If an appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this section for any reason is determined by the United States Department of the Treasury or any other qualified state or federal authority to have been made for an improper use:

(1) the appropriated money may not be spent and shall
be retained in the treasury and available for later legislative
appropriation; and

(2) an amount equal to the amount of the appropriation
that was determined to have been made for an improper use is
appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Higher Education
Coordinating Board for the purpose and period described by
Subsection (a) of this section.

E. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9a (4) to allow the Conference
 Committee to add text on any matter which is not included in either
 the House or Senate version of the bill to read as follows:

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4 SECTION 16. DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES: RTO 5 GRANDE VALLEY. The amount of \$16,700,000 is appropriated to the Department of State Health Services from money received by this 6 state from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. 7 8 Section 802) established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and deposited to the credit of the Coronavirus 9 10 Relief Fund No. 325 for the purpose of upgrading existing laboratory facilities associated with a level 1 trauma facility in 11 Hidalgo County and new laboratory infrastructure in Starr County 12 during the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this 13 14 Act.

15 F. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9a (4) to allow the Conference 16 Committee to add text on any matter which is not included in either 17 the House or Senate version of the bill to read as follows:

SECTION 25. DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION **RESOURCES:** 18 CYBERSECURITY PROJECTS. 19 (a) The amount of \$200,000,000 is appropriated to the Department of Information Resources for deposit 20 into the Technology Improvement and Modernization Fund No. 187 and 21 for use during the two-year period beginning on the effective date 22 23 of this Act for the purpose of cybersecurity projects from money 24 received by this state from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery 25 Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and deposited to the credit of 26 the Coronavirus Relief Fund No. 325. 27 Before spending money

1 appropriated under this subsection, the department must receive 2 approval for the proposed cybersecurity projects from the Joint 3 Oversight Committee on Investment in Information Technology 4 Improvement and Modernization Projects established under Section 5 2054.578, Government Code.

6 (b) The capital budget authority of the Department of 7 Information Resources in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th 8 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations 9 Act), is increased by \$200,000,000 for the appropriation made under 10 Subsection (a) of this section.

11 G. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9b (4) to allow the Conference 12 Committee to exceed the amount of an item of appropriation 13 contained in one version of the bill to read as follows:

SECTION 31. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION: PRESIDIO CUSTOMS 14 15 INSPECTION STATION. The amount of \$15,500,000 is appropriated to the Department of Transportation from money received by this state 16 17 from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. 18 No. 117-2) and deposited to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief 19 Fund No. 325 for the purpose of providing funding for a customs 20 inspection station on the South Orient Rail Line in Presidio, 21 Texas, during the two-year period beginning on the effective date 22 23 of this Act.

H. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9a (4) to allow the Conference
Committee to add text on any matter which is not included in either
the House or Senate version of the bill to read as follows:

27 SECTION 32. TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM: TRS-CARE AND

1 TRS-ACTIVECARE. (a) The amount of \$286,337,761 is appropriated to the Teacher Retirement System from money received by this state 2 3 from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. 4 No. 117-2) and deposited to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief 5 Fund No. 325 for the purpose of providing funding during the 6 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for 7 8 coronavirus-related claims in TRS-Care and TRS-ActiveCare.

9 (b) It is the intent of the legislature that premiums for 10 TRS-Care and TRS-ActiveCare insurance policies not increase as a 11 result of coronavirus-related claims.

12 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b) of this section, it is 13 the intent of the legislature that the premiums for TRS-Care and 14 TRS-ActiveCare programs be calculated and adjusted taking into 15 consideration the money appropriated under this section.

16 I. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9a (4) to allow the Conference 17 Committee to add text on any matter which is not included in either 18 the House or Senate version of the bill to read as follows:

SECTION 33. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: STAFFING 19 The amount of \$378,300,000 is appropriated to the 20 NEEDS. (a) Health and Human Services Commission from money received by this 21 state from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. 22 23 Section 802) established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 24 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and deposited to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief Fund No. 325 for the purpose of providing funding during the 25 26 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the Health and Human Services Commission to administer one-time grants 27

1 related to providing critical staffing needs resulting from 2 frontline health care workers affected by COVID-19, including 3 recruitment and retention bonuses for staff:

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4 (1) of nursing facilities, assisted living 5 facilities, home health agencies, and facilities that serve persons 6 with intellectual or developmental disabilities in an intermediate 7 care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities or 8 related conditions (ICF/IID); or

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(2) who provide community attendant services.

10 (b) It is the intent of the legislature that the Health and Human Services Commission prioritize grants to grantees that comply 11 12 with the reporting requirements prescribed by Rider 143 (Health and Human Services Commission), Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th 13 14 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations 15 Act), the reporting requirements established by Chapter 588 (S.B. 809), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 2021, or equivalent reporting 16 17 requirements established by the Health and Human Services Commission. 18

Annually, the Health and Human Services Commission 19 (C) shall report to the Legislative Budget Board the grants awarded 20 21 under this section. The report must include, for the year covered by the report, the amount of grants awarded, the award recipients, 22 23 and the total amount of each grant used by the recipient. The 24 report must be submitted to the Legislative Budget Board not later than December 1 of the year in which the report is due. 25

26 (d) Of the amount appropriated under Subsection (a) of this27 section:

H.R. No. 297 1 (1) \$200,000,000 shall be used only for grants for 2 nursing facilities; and

3 (2) \$178,300,000 shall be used only for grants for 4 assisted living facilities, home health agencies, community 5 attendants, and facilities that serve persons with intellectual or 6 developmental disabilities in an intermediate care facility for 7 individuals with intellectual disabilities or related conditions 8 (ICF/IID).

9 (e) It is the intent of the legislature that the Health and 10 Human Services Commission consider federal COVID-19 relief money 11 received by providers when allocating the money described by 12 Subsection (d)(2) of this section.

13 J. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9b (4) to allow the Conference 14 Committee to exceed the amount of an item of appropriation 15 contained in one version of the bill to read as follows:

16 SECTION 34. DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES: FEDERALLY 17 QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTER INCUBATOR PROGRAM. The amount of \$20,000,000 is appropriated to the Department of State Health 18 19 Services from money received by this state from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established 20 under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and 21 deposited to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief Fund No. 325 for 22 23 use during the two-year period beginning on the effective date of 24 this Act for the Federally Qualified Health Center Incubator 25 Program.

26 K. Suspend House Rule 13, Section 9b (5) to allow the Conference 27 Committee to add an item of appropriation that is not in either

5 SECTION 35. DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES: EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. (a) The amount of \$21,700,000 is appropriated to 6 the Department of State Health Services from money received by this 7 8 state from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 9 10 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and deposited to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief Fund No. 325 for the purpose of providing funding for 11 12 emergency medical response service staffing, including:

6 (F) the time during which money received by the 7 agency or institution was spent by the agency or institution, 8 including the remaining time in which the agency or institution may 9 spend the money without further appropriation.

10 (b) This section does not apply to a hospital licensed under 11 Chapter 241, Health and Safety Code, or a hospital owned and 12 operated by this state.

(c) It is the intent of the legislature that information required to be provided in a report on the Legislative Budget Board's Internet website under Subsection (a) of this section must be updated not less than once during each fiscal quarter and once on the first day of each fiscal quarter that occurs on or after December 1, 2021, until at least December 1, 2028.
