- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 161.0015 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 161.0015. COVID-19 VACCINE MANDATES PROHIBITED. (a)
- 8 In this section, "governmental entity" means this state, a local
- 9 government entity as defined by Section 418.004, Government Code,
- 10 or an agency of this state or a local government entity.
- (b) A governmental entity may not implement, order, or
- 12 otherwise impose a mandate requiring an individual to be vaccinated
- 13 <u>against COVID-19.</u>
- 14 (c) An individual who is the subject of a violation of
- 15 Subsection (b) may bring an action in a district court in the county
- 16 in which the violation occurred for injunctive relief to prevent
- 17 further violation of that subsection.
- 18 <u>(d) A claimant may recover reasonable expenses incurred in</u>
- 19 bringing an action under Subsection (c), including court costs,
- 20 attorney's fees, investigation costs, witness fees, and deposition
- 21 <u>expenses.</u>
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 161.0015, Health and Safety Code, as
- 23 added by this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after
- 24 the effective date of this Act.
