A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to an interstate compact on border security and
3	immigration enforcement.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Title 7, Government Code, is amended by adding
6	Chapter 794 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 794. INTERSTATE COMPACT FOR BORDER SECURITY
8	Sec. 794.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "illegal alien"
9	means a person who:
10	(1) is not a citizen or national of the United States;
11	and
12	(2) is unlawfully present in the United States
13	according to the terms of 8 U.S.C. Section 1101 et seq.
14	Sec. 794.002. AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE INTERSTATE COMPACT. On
15	behalf of this state, the governor may:
16	(1) coordinate, develop, and execute an interstate
17	compact for border security among interested states; and
18	(2) seek the approval of the United States Congress
19	for the compact.
20	Sec. 794.003. CONGRESSIONAL APPROVAL. The compact
21	authorized by this chapter takes effect only if approved by the
22	United States Congress not later than the 10th anniversary of the
23	date the compact is executed by the governor under Section 794.002.
24	Sec. 794.004. INTERSTATE COMPACT PROVISIONS. The compact

- 1 authorized by this chapter must provide for joint action among
- 2 compacting states on matters that include:
- 3 <u>(1) the operational control of this state's border</u>
- 4 with Mexico by the total detection and apprehension or deflection
- 5 of illegal aliens attempting to cross the border into this state;
- 6 and
- 7 (2) any other enforcement of federal immigration laws,
- 8 including the detecting, apprehending, detaining, prosecuting,
- 9 releasing, and monitoring of illegal aliens.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 15 legislative session.
