A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of local governmental entities to mandate
- 3 COVID-19 vaccinations for entity employees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 161.0055 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 161.0055. LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY AUTHORITY TO
- 8 MANDATE COVID-19 VACCINATIONS FOR ENTITY EMPLOYEES. (a) In this
- 9 <u>section:</u>
- 10 (1) "COVID-19" means the 2019 novel coronavirus
- 11 disease.
- 12 (2) "Local governmental entity" has the meaning
- 13 <u>assigned by Section 554.001, Government Code.</u>
- 14 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a local governmental
- 15 entity may, as a condition of employment, require an entity
- 16 employee to provide to the entity in the form and manner prescribed
- 17 by the entity documentation of the employee's COVID-19 vaccination,
- 18 including any recommended booster dose of the vaccine.
- (c) A local governmental entity that requires an entity
- 20 employee to be vaccinated against COVID-19 under Subsection (b)
- 21 shall allow the employee to claim an exemption from the required
- 22 vaccination based on a medical condition or a religious belief if
- 23 the employee submits to the entity on the form prescribed under
- 24 <u>Subsection (d):</u>

- 1 (1) an affidavit signed by a physician who is duly
- 2 registered and licensed to practice medicine in the United States
- 3 stating that, in the physician's opinion, the required vaccination
- 4 poses a significant risk to the employee's health; or
- 5 (2) an affidavit signed by the employee or, if the
- 6 employee is a minor, by the employee's parent or guardian stating
- 7 that the employee declines immunization for a specified and
- 8 verifiable religious-based reason and that the immunization
- 9 conflicts with the tenets and practices of a recognized church or
- 10 religious denomination of which the employee is an adherent or
- 11 member.
- 12 (d) The Texas Workforce Commission shall develop and make
- 13 available on the workforce commission's Internet website blank
- 14 affidavit forms to be used by an employee who claims an exemption
- 15 from a required COVID-19 vaccination under Subsection (c).
- 16 (e) An executive order, proclamation, or regulation issued
- 17 under Chapter 418, Government Code, may not suspend, limit, or
- 18 alter this section or an employment condition established by a
- 19 local governmental entity under this section.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 25 legislative session.
