WHEREAS, This treasured Texan was baptized at Mount Moriah Missionary Baptist Church at the age of 12, and over the next 80 years, she faithfully served the church in numerous capacities; in her youth, she was a member of several auxiliaries, and she later taught Sunday school and Vacation Bible School; she established Family Night at the church, and she was a full-time employee of the church's day-care center for 16 years; her passion for service had inspired her to attain her nursing license, and she enjoyed two decades of service as a nurse at Methodist Hospital from the mid-1950s until her retirement in 1976; and

WHEREAS, Vestana was the mother of two children, and she was blessed with a family of nine grandchildren, 18 great-grandchildren, and six great-great-grandchildren, who enriched her life immeasurably; and
