FLOOR AMENDMENT NO.____

- 1 Amend S.B. No. 2185 (house committee printing) by striking
- 2 all below the enacting clause and substituting the following:
- 3 SECTION 1. In this Act, "district" means the Hidalgo County
- 4 Water Improvement District No. 3.
- 5 SECTION 2. GENERAL MANAGER. The general manager shall be an
- 6 employee of the district. The general manager serves at the
- 7 pleasure of and reports only to the board. The general manager may
- 8 not serve as a director on the board of directors of the district.
- 9 SECTION 3. EDUCATION PROGRAM. (a) The district's board of
- 10 directors shall establish a program of education for the district's
- 11 directors that includes information on:
- 12 (1) the history of the district;
- 13 (2) the district's statutory authority;
- 14 (3) laws applicable to the district, including the
- 15 requirements of Chapters 551 and 552, Government Code;
- 16 (4) relevant legal developments related to water
- 17 district governance;
- 18 (5) the duties and responsibilities of the district's
- 19 board of directors;
- 20 (6) conflict of interest laws and other laws related to
- 21 public officials;
- 22 (7) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the Texas
- 23 Commission on Environmental Quality or the Texas Ethics
- 24 Commission.
- 25 (b) The district shall pay any costs associated with the

- 1 development of the education program from district revenue.
- 2 (c) The education program may include training provided by an
- 3 organization offering courses that have been approved by the Texas
- 4 Commission on Environmental Quality.
- 5 (d) The district's board of directors may adopt bylaws
- 6 modifying the education program as necessary to meet district
- 7 needs.
- 8 SECTION 4. EDUCATION FOR DIRECTORS. (a) Each director of the
- 9 district shall complete the education program established under
- 10 Section 3 of this Act before the first anniversary of the date on
- 11 which the director was appointed or elected. A director serving
- 12 on the district's board of directors on the effective date of this
- 13 Act shall complete the education program not later than September
- 14 1, 2022.
- 15 (b) The district shall reimburse a director of the district
- 16 for the reasonable expenses incurred by the director in attending
- 17 the education program.
- 18 (c) A director of the district who is elected to serve a
- 19 subsequent term shall fulfill the education requirements specified
- 20 by district bylaws.
- 21 SECTION 5. PROHIBITED CONDUCT FOR DIRECTORS AND DISTRICT
- 22 EMPLOYEES. A director of the district or a district employee may
- 23 not:
- 24 (1) accept or solicit any gift, favor, or service that:
- 25 (A) might reasonably influence the director or
- 26 employee in the discharge of an official duty; or
- 27 (B) the director or employee knows or should know

- 1 is offered with the intent to influence the director's or
- 2 employee's official conduct;
- 3 (2) accept other employment or engage in a business or
- 4 professional activity that the director or employee might
- 5 reasonably expect would require or induce the director or employee
- 6 to disclose confidential information acquired in the course of the
- 7 director's or employee's duties under this chapter;
- 8 (3) accept other employment or compensation that could
- 9 reasonably be expected to impair the director's or employee's
- 10 independent judgment in the performance of the director's or
- 11 employee's duties under this chapter;
- 12 (4) make personal investments that could reasonably be
- 13 expected to create a substantial conflict between the director's
- 14 or employee's private interest and the interest of the district;
- 15 (5) intentionally or knowingly solicit, accept, or agree
- 16 to accept a benefit for the director's or employee's exercise of
- 17 powers under this chapter or performance of duties under this
- 18 chapter in favor of a third party; or
- 19 (6) have a personal interest in an agreement executed by
- 20 the district.
- 21 SECTION 6. SEARCHABLE DISTRICT EXPENDITURE DATABASE. (a) The
- 22 district shall establish and post on the district's Internet
- 23 website a database of district check register reporters, including
- 24 district expenditures and contracts. The database must include the
- 25 amount, date, description, payor, and payee of the expenditures
- 26 and, if applicable, parties to the contract.
- 27 (b) The district may not include in the database developed

- 1 under Subsection (a) a district employee's salary or personal
- 2 identifying information, as defined by Section 521.002, Business
- 3 & Commerce Code.
- 4 (c) The district shall prominently display a link to the
- 5 database established under this section on the district's Internet
- 6 website. The information provided in the district check register
- 7 reports must be updated monthly.
- 8 (d) The district shall keep in the database information
- 9 required by this section related to an adopted budget until the
- 10 third anniversary of the date the budget was adopted.
- 11 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
