A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to access by a hiring law enforcement agency to an 3 applicant's employment records.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, is amended 6 by amending Subsection (a-1) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to 7 read as follows:

(a-1) A law enforcement agency that obtains a consent form 8 9 described by Subsection (a)(2)(B) shall make an electronic copy of 10 person's employment records available to a hiring law the enforcement agency on request. The commission by rule shall 11 prescribe the manner by which a law enforcement agency shall make a 12 person's employment records electronically available to a hiring 13 14 law enforcement agency. The rules must provide appropriate privacy 15 and security protections.

16 (d) A law enforcement agency that makes a person's 17 employment records available to a hiring law enforcement agency 18 under Subsection (a-1) shall provide a copy of the records to the 19 person.

20 <u>(e) A law enforcement agency that obtains employment</u> 21 <u>records under this section may not disclose any information</u> 22 <u>contained in the records.</u>

23 SECTION 2. Section 1701.456(b), Occupations Code, is 24 amended to read as follows:

1 (b) A law enforcement agency, agency head, or other law

3 (1) a report made by that agency or person if the 4 report is made in good faith; or

5 (2) making a person's employment records available to
6 a hiring law enforcement agency under Section 1701.451(a-1).

SECTION 3. Subchapter J, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
amended by adding Section 1701.459 to read as follows:

9 <u>Sec. 1701.459. CERTAIN AGREEMENTS RELATED TO EMPLOYMENT</u> 10 <u>RECORDS PROHIBITED. A person licensed under this chapter may not</u> 11 <u>enter into an agreement with a law enforcement agency employing the</u> 12 <u>person under which the agency is prohibited from making the</u> 13 <u>person's employment records available to another law enforcement</u> 14 <u>agency under Section 1701.451(a-1).</u>

15 SECTION 4. (a) Not later than December 1, 2021, the Texas 16 Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt rules as necessary to 17 comply with Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, as amended by this 18 Act.

(b) Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to the hiring of a person by a law enforcement agency that occurs on or after December 1, 2021. The hiring of a person by a law enforcement agency that occurs before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

26 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
