## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the composition of districts for the election of
- 3 members of the Texas House of Representatives.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to fulfill the
- 6 legislature's duty under Section 28, Article III, Texas
- 7 Constitution, to redraw the districts for the election of the
- 8 members of the Texas House of Representatives in compliance with
- 9 the United States and Texas Constitutions and applicable federal
- 10 law following the publication of the 2020 federal decennial census.
- 11 SECTION 2. The districts from which the members of the Texas
- 12 House of Representatives are elected are the districts as provided
- 13 by law and used for the election of the members of the House of
- 14 Representatives of the 87th Legislature except as those districts
- 15 are changed by Section 3 of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 3. (a) The portion of House District 3 located in
- 17 Montgomery County tract 690401, block 1000, is transferred to House
- 18 District 15.
- 19 (b) The portion of House District 64 located in Denton
- 20 County tract 020800, block 1041, is transferred to House District
- 21 63.
- (c) The portion of House District 93 located in Tarrant
- 23 County tract 114103, block 1001, is transferred to House District
- 24 99.

- 1 SECTION 4. In this Act, "tract," "block group," and "block"
- 2 mean the geographic areas identified by those terms on the 2010
- 3 Census TIGER/Line Shapefiles, prepared by the federal Bureau of the
- 4 Census for the Twenty-third Decennial Census of the United States,
- 5 enumerated as of April 1, 2010.
- 6 SECTION 5. It is the intent of the legislature that if any
- 7 county, tract, block group, block, or other geographic area has
- 8 erroneously been left out of this Act, a court reviewing this Act
- 9 should include that area in the appropriate district in accordance
- 10 with the intent of the legislature, using any available evidence of
- 11 that intent, including evidence such as that used by the Supreme
- 12 Court of Texas in Smith v. Patterson, 111 Tex. 535, 242 S.W. 749
- 13 (1922).
- 14 SECTION 6. (a) This Act supersedes all previous enactments
- 15 or orders adopting districts for the Texas House of
- 16 Representatives. All previous acts of the legislature adopting
- 17 districts for the Texas House of Representatives are repealed.
- 18 (b) Chapter 2 (S.B. 3), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, 1st
- 19 Called Session, 2013 (Article 195a-13, Vernon's Texas Civil
- 20 Statutes), is repealed.
- 21 SECTION 7. The districts established in this Act apply to
- 22 the election of the members of the Texas House of Representatives
- 23 beginning with the primary and general elections in 2022 for
- 24 members of the 88th Legislature. This Act does not affect the
- 25 membership or districts of the House of Representatives of the 87th
- 26 Texas Legislature.
- 27 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
