8	Sec. 101.0216. LIABILITY OF MUNICIPALITY FOR FAILURE TO
9	COMPLY WITH IMMIGRATION DETAINER REQUEST. (a) Except as provided
10	by Subsection (e), a municipality that releases from custody a
11	person who is the subject of an immigration detainer request issued
12	by United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement is liable for
13	damages resulting from a felony committed by the person in this
14	state within 10 years following the person's release if:
15	(1) the municipality did not detain the person as
16	requested;
17	(2) the person was not a citizen of the United States
18	at the time of release; and
19	(3) the attorney general has filed a petition or
20	applied for equitable relief under Section 752.055, Government
21	Code, against the municipality.
22	(b) An immigration detainer request described by Subsection
23	(a) is presumed to be valid, regardless of whether the detainer is
24	written or verbal.

1	(c) This section does not create liability for damages that
2	a person who is subject to an immigration detainer request sustains
3	following the person's release by a municipality.
4	(d) Governmental immunity of a municipality to suit is
5	waived and abolished to the extent of liability created by this
6	section.
7	(e) A municipality is not liable under Subsection (a) for
8	damages incurred after United States Immigration and Customs
9	Enforcement subsequently detains the person described by that
10	subsection.
11	SECTION 2. Section 101.0216, Civil Practice and Remedies
12	Code, as added by this Act, applies only with respect to the release
13	of a person from custody on or after the effective date of this Act.
14	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
