A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to state occupational licensing of certain military
- 3 veterans and military spouses.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.052, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a-1), (b-1), and (f) and adding Subsection
- 7 (i) to read as follows:
- 8 (a-1) The commissioner may adopt rules establishing
- 9 exceptions to the examination requirements prescribed by
- 10 Subsection (a)(3) for an educator $\underline{\text{who is a military veteran or}}$
- 11 <u>military spouse or is</u> from outside the state to obtain a certificate
- 12 in this state.
- 13 (b-1) The board shall propose rules <u>in accordance with</u>
- 14 Sections 55.005 and 55.006, Occupations Code, to establish
- 15 procedures to expedite the processing of an application for a
- 16 certificate under this section submitted by an educator who is a
- 17 military veteran or military [the] spouse [of a person who is
- 18 serving on active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United
- 19 States], including rules for providing a permanent change of
- 20 station order or military identification card [the appropriate
- 21 documentation to establish the educator's status as a spouse of a
- 22 person who is serving on active duty as a member of the armed forces
- 23 of the United States].
- 24 (f) The board shall post on the board's Internet website the

- 1 procedures for obtaining a certificate under Subsection (a) and the
- 2 notice required under Section 55.010, Occupations Code.
- 3 <u>(i) In this section:</u>
- 4 (1) "Active duty" means current full-time military
- 5 service in the armed forces of the United States or active duty
- 6 military service as a member of the Texas military forces, as
- 7 <u>defined by Section 437.001</u>, Government Code, or similar military
- 8 service of another state.
- 9 (2) "Armed forces of the United States" means the
- 10 army, navy, air force, coast guard, or marine corps of the United
- 11 States or a reserve unit of one of those branches of the armed
- 12 forces.
- 13 (3) "Military service member" means a person who is on
- 14 active duty.
- 15 (4) "Military spouse" means a person who is married to
- 16 <u>a military service member.</u>
- 17 (5) "Military veteran" means a person who has served
- 18 on active duty and who was discharged or released from active duty.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 55.004, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 20 adding Subsections (a-1) and (d) to read as follows:
- 21 <u>(a-1) In adopting rules under Subsection (a), the state</u>
- 22 agency shall ensure that a military veteran or military spouse
- 23 receives appropriate credit for the individual's experience,
- 24 including clinical and professional experience, in a licensed
- 25 profession.
- 26 (d) A state agency that issues a license that has a
- 27 residency requirement for license eligibility shall adopt rules to

- 1 allow a military spouse applicant to establish residency for
- 2 purposes of this subsection by providing to the agency a copy of the
- 3 permanent change of station order for the military service member
- 4 to whom the spouse is married or the spouse's military
- 5 identification card.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 55.0041(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Before engaging in the practice of the business or
- 9 occupation, the military spouse must:
- 10 (1) notify the applicable state agency of the spouse's
- 11 intent to practice in this state;
- 12 (2) submit to the agency proof of the spouse's
- 13 residency in this state by providing to the agency [and] a copy of:
- 14 (A) the permanent change of station order for the
- 15 military service member to whom the spouse is married; or
- 16 <u>(B)</u> the spouse's military identification card;
- 17 and
- 18 (3) receive from the agency confirmation that:
- 19 (A) the agency has verified the spouse's license
- 20 in the other jurisdiction; and
- 21 (B) the spouse is authorized to engage in the
- 22 business or occupation in accordance with this section.
- 23 SECTION 4. Section 2, Chapter 1048 (H.B. 1934), Acts of the
- 24 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is repealed.
- 25 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 26 an initial application for or an application for renewal of an
- 27 occupational license or certificate filed on or after the effective

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- 1 date of this Act. An application for a license or certificate filed
- 2 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 3 effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in
- 4 effect for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
