A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to state occupational licensing of certain military 1-18 1-19 veterans and military spouses. 1-20

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-21 SECTION 1. Section 21.052, Education Code, is amended by 1-22 1-23 amending Subsections (a-1), (b-1), and (f) and adding Subsection (i) to read as follows:

(a-1) The commissioner may adopt rules establishing 1-24 1-25 exceptions to the examination requirements prescribed by 1-26 Subsection (a)(3) for an educator from outside the state, including 1-27 1-28 military service members, military spouses, and military veterans, to obtain a certificate in this state.

(b-1) The board shall propose rules in accordance with 1-29 Chapter 55, Occupations Code, to establish procedures to expedite 1-30 the processing of an application for a certificate under this section submitted by an educator who is <u>a military veteran or</u> <u>military</u> [the] spouse [of a person who is serving on active duty as 1-31 1-32 1-33 a member of the armed forces of the United States], including rules 1-34 1-35 for providing a permanent change of station order for purposes of 1-36 establishing residency and for providing a military identification card [the appropriate documentation to establish the educator's status as a spouse of a person who is serving on active duty as a 1-37 1-38 member of the armed forces of the United States]. 1-39

(f) The board shall post on the board's Internet website the 1-40 1-41 procedures for obtaining a certificate under Subsection (a) and the 1-42 notice required under Section 55.010, Occupations Code. 1-43 (i)

In this section: (1) "Active duty" means current full-time military 1-44 1-45 service in the armed forces of the United States or active duty military service as a member of the Texas military forces, as defined by Section 437.001, Government Code, or similar military service of another state. 1-46 1-47 1-48

1-60 to read as follows: (2) "Armed forces of the United States" means the 1-61

Section 55.004, Occupations Code, is amended by 2-5 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 2-6 follows: 2-7 (c) In addition to the rules adopted under Subsection (a), a 2-8 state agency that issues a license may adopt rules that would 2-9 establish alternate methods for a military service member, military veteran, or military spouse to demonstrate competency to meet the 2-10 2-11 requirements for obtaining the license, including receiving appropriate credit for training, education, and clinical and 2-12 professional experience. 2-13 (d) A state agency that issues a license that has a residency requirement for license eligibility shall adopt rules regarding documentation necessary for a military spouse applicant 2-14 2**-**15 2**-**16 2-17 to establish residency for purposes of this subsection, including 2-18 by providing to the agency a copy of the permanent change of station order for the military service member to whom the spouse is married. 2-19 2-20 2-21 SECTION 4. Section 55.0041(b), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 2-22 (b) Before engaging in the practice of the business or occupation, the military spouse must: 2-23 2-24 (1) notify the applicable state agency of the spouse's 2**-**25 2**-**26 intent to practice in this state; agency proof of the spouse's (2) submit to the residency in this state in accordance with rules adopted under Section 55.004(d) and a copy of the spouse's military 2-27 2-28 2-29 identification card; and 2-30 receive from the agency confirmation that: (3) 2-31 (A) the agency has verified the spouse's license 2-32 in the other jurisdiction; and 2-33 (B) the spouse is authorized to engage in the 2-34 business or occupation in accordance with this section. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 2-35 2-36 an initial application for or an application for renewal of an occupational license or certificate filed on or after the effective 2-37 2-38 date of this Act.
