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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to renaming the Center for Elimination of Disproportionality and Disparities to the office of health equity 3 and to the duties of that office. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 107A, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 CHAPTER 107A. OFFICE OF HEALTH EQUITY [CENTER FOR ELIMINATION OF 8 **DISPROPORTIONALITY AND DISPARITIES**] 9 Sec. 107A.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "office" means 10 the office of health equity established under this chapter. 11 12 Sec. 107A.002. OFFICE OF HEALTH EQUITY [107A.001. CENTER FOR ELIMINATION OF DISPROPORTIONALITY AND DISPARITIES]. (a) The 13 14 executive commissioner shall maintain an office of health equity within [a center for elimination of disproportionality and 15 disparities in] the commission to: 16 assume a leadership role in working or contracting 17 (1) with state and federal agencies, universities, private interest 18 groups, communities, foundations, and offices of minority health to 19 develop health initiatives to decrease or eliminate health and 20 21 health access disparities [among racial, multicultural, disadvantaged, ethnic, and regional populations, including 22 23 appropriate language services;] and improve health equity across the state, including rural and urban communities, regardless of a 24

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1 person's race, ethnicity, or socioeconomic status; and

2 (2) maximize use of existing resources without3 duplicating existing efforts.

4 (b) The health initiatives developed under Subsection (a)
5 must include initiatives to increase access to appropriate language
6 services in health care settings.

7 Sec. <u>107A.003</u> [107A.002]. POWERS OF <u>OFFICE</u> [CENTER]. The 8 <u>office</u> [center] may:

9 (1) provide a central information and referral source, 10 including a clearinghouse for health disparities information, and 11 serve as the primary state resource in coordinating, planning, and 12 advocating access to health care services to eliminate health 13 disparities in this state;

14 (2) coordinate conferences and other training 15 opportunities to increase skills among state agencies and 16 government staff in management and in the appreciation of cultural 17 diversity;

18 (3) pursue and administer grant funds for innovative19 projects for communities, groups, and individuals;

20 (4) provide recommendations and training in improving
21 minority recruitment in state agencies;

(5) publicize information regarding health and minority health issues through the use of the media;

(6) network with existing minority organizations,
 community-based health groups, and statewide health coalitions;
 (7) solicit, receive, and spend grants, gifts, and

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1 donations from public and private sources; and

2 (8) contract with public and private entities in the3 performance of its responsibilities.

Sec. <u>107A.004</u> [107A.003]. FUNDING. The commission may distribute to the <u>office</u> [center] unobligated and unexpended appropriations to be used to carry out <u>the office's</u> [its] powers <u>and</u> <u>perform the office's duties</u>.

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
