A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to measures to assist students enrolled at public institutions of higher education who are homeless or who are or were 3 in foster care. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 51.9356, Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 Sec. 51.9356. DESIGNATION OF LIAISON OFFICER TO ASSIST 8 STUDENTS WHO ARE OR WERE IN FOSTER CARE OR WHO ARE HOMELESS. (a) In 9 10 this section: (1) "Institution[, "institution] of higher education" 11 12 has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003. 13 (2) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning 14 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C. Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student 15 16 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education during an academic term but who are homeless between academic 17 18 terms. (b) Each institution of higher education shall designate at 19 least one employee of the institution to act as a liaison officer 20 21 for current and incoming: 22 (1) students [at the institution] who are or were 23 [formerly] in the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services; and 24

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(2) students who are homeless.

2 (c) To the extent allowed by state or federal law, <u>an</u> [the] 3 institution <u>of higher education</u> shall identify [those] students 4 <u>described by Subsection (b)</u> from information provided to the 5 institution in admission or financial aid applications or other 6 available resources.

7 <u>(d) An institution of higher education may designate under</u> 8 <u>Subsection (b) the same employee or employees to act as liaison</u> 9 <u>officer for each student population described in that subsection or</u> 10 <u>one or more different employees to act as liaison officer for each</u> 11 <u>of those student populations separately.</u>

12 (e) [(c)] Each semester or other academic term, an 13 institution of higher education shall provide to the institution's 14 liaison officer <u>or officers</u> the names of and information regarding 15 the students described by Subsection (b) <u>for whom the officer is</u> 16 <u>designated</u>.

17 (f) A [(d) The] liaison officer shall provide to the 18 students described by Subsection (b) for whom the officer is 19 designated information regarding support services including 20 financial aid, on-campus and off-campus housing, food and meal 21 programs, and counseling services, [and] other resources available 22 to the students at the institution of higher education, and any 23 other relevant information to assist the students.

24 <u>(g) A</u> [(e) The] liaison officer may participate in any 25 training that enables the officer to carry out the officer's duties 26 and coordinate with liaison officers at other educational 27 institutions.

1 (h) [(f)] Each institution of higher education shall 2 publicize, including through the institution's Internet website, 3 social media, electronic mail, or other means of communication used 4 by the institution:

5 (1) the name of and contact information for the 6 institution's liaison officer <u>or officers</u>; and

7 (2) information regarding support services and other
8 resources available at the institution to the students described by
9 Subsection (b).

SECTION 2. The heading to Section 51.978, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

12 Sec. 51.978. TEMPORARY HOUSING BETWEEN ACADEMIC TERMS FOR 13 CERTAIN STUDENTS <u>WHO WERE</u> [FORMERLY] UNDER CONSERVATORSHIP OF 14 DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES OR WHO ARE HOMELESS.

SECTION 3. Section 51.978(a), Education Code, is amended by adding Subdivision (3) to read as follows:

17 <u>(3) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning</u> 18 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C. 19 Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student 20 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education 21 during an academic term but who are homeless between academic 22 terms.

23 SECTION 4. Section 51.978(b), Education Code, is amended to 24 read as follows:

(b) To be eligible to receive housing assistance from an institution of higher education under Subsection (c), a student must:

1 (1)be: 2 (A) a student who has [have] been under the 3 conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services or its predecessor in function on the day preceding: 4 5 (i) [(A)] the student's 18th birthday; or 6 <u>(ii)</u> [(B)] the date the student's 7 disabilities of minority are removed by a court under Chapter 31, 8 Family Code; or 9 (B) a student who is homeless; be enrolled full-time at the institution during 10 (2) the academic term immediately preceding the period for which the 11 12 student requests the housing assistance; (3) be registered or otherwise have taken the actions 13 14 required by the institution to permit the student to enroll 15 full-time at the institution during the academic term immediately following the period for which the student requests the housing 16 assistance; and 17 (4) lack other reasonable temporary 18 housing 19 alternatives between the academic terms described by Subdivisions (2) and (3), as determined by the institution. 20 21 SECTION 5. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 51.9781 to read as follows: 22 Sec. 51.9781. PRIORITY ACCESS TO STUDENT HOUSING 23 FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE HOMELESS. (a) In this section: 24 25 (1) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning 26 assigned by Section 61.003. 27 (2) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning

6	(b) Each institution of higher education that maintains
7	student housing facilities shall give priority in the assignment of
8	housing in those facilities to students who are homeless.
9	SECTION 6. Section 61.0908, Education Code, is amended to
10	read as follows:
11	Sec. 61.0908. DESIGNATION OF LIAISON OFFICER TO ASSIST
12	STUDENTS <u>WHO WERE</u> [FORMERLY] IN FOSTER CARE <u>OR WHO ARE HOMELESS</u> .
13	(a) In this section, "students who are homeless" has the meaning
14	assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
15	Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student
16	housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education
17	during an academic term but who are homeless between academic
18	terms.
19	(b) The board shall designate at least one employee of the
20	board to act as a liaison officer for the following current and
21	incoming students at institutions of higher education:
22	(1) students who were formerly in the conservatorship
23	of the Department of Family and Protective Services; and
24	(2) students who are homeless.
25	(c) The board may designate under Subsection (b) the same
26	employee or employees to act as liaison officer for each student
27	population described in that subsection or one or more different

employees to act as liaison officer for each of those student 1 populations separately. A [The] liaison officer shall assist the 2 students for whom the officer is designated in coordinating college 3 4 readiness and student success efforts relating to the [those] 5 students. 6 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply 7 beginning with the 2021-2022 academic year. 8 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11

12 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
