A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of a grant program for promoting
- 3 computer science certification and professional development in
- 4 coding, technology applications, cybersecurity, and computer
- 5 science for public school teachers.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter J, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 21.466 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 21.466. COMPUTER SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY APPLICATIONS
- 10 PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT GRANT PROGRAM. (a) In this section,
- 11 "institution of higher education" has the meaning assigned by
- 12 Section 61.003.
- 13 <u>(b) The commissioner may establish a competitive</u>
- 14 professional development grant program to encourage teachers to:
- 15 <u>(1) obtain computer science certification; and</u>
- 16 (2) continue professional development in coding,
- 17 computational thinking, cybersecurity, and computer science
- 18 <u>education</u>.
- (c) From any federal funds available for this purpose, the
- 20 commissioner may make grants to eligible providers that offer:
- 21 (1) professional development for classroom teachers
- 22 to ensure teachers maintain a working knowledge of current computer
- 23 industry standard tools and resources; and
- 24 (2) training for computer science certification for

- 1 teachers in accordance with certification requirements adopted by
- 2 the State Board for Educator Certification.
- 3 (d) To be eligible to receive a grant under this section, a
- 4 provider must:
- 5 (1) be an institution of higher education, regional
- 6 education service center, or school district or partnership of
- 7 multiple school districts or a nonprofit entity approved by the
- 8 commissioner that has demonstrated experience in providing
- 9 professional development through a statewide network; and
- 10 (2) meet eligibility standards established by
- 11 commissioner rule.
- 12 (e) An eligible provider receiving a grant under this
- 13 section must:
- 14 (1) provide the training or professional development
- 15 <u>described by Subsection (c) and establish professional dev</u>elopment
- 16 <u>hubs in each education service center region;</u>
- 17 (2) serve high-need campuses;
- 18 (3) have established partnerships with institution of
- 19 higher education faculty with expertise in cybersecurity,
- 20 computing, and computer science education; and
- 21 (4) develop partnerships with computer industry
- 22 professionals.
- 23 (f) The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to
- 24 implement this section.
- 25 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
