- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 229, Local
- 6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER B. REGULATION OF OUTDOOR LIGHTING NEAR MAJOR
- 8 ASTRONOMICAL OBSERVATORY
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 229, Local Government Code, is amended 10 by adding Subchapter C to read as follows:
- 11 SUBCHAPTER C. GENERAL REGULATION OF OUTDOOR LIGHTING BY CERTAIN
- 12 MUNICIPALITIES
- Sec. 229.101. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "outdoor
- 14 lighting" has the meaning assigned by Section 240.031.
- 15 Sec. 229.102. NO LIMITATION ON OTHER AUTHORITY. This
- 16 subchapter does not limit the authority of a municipality to
- 17 regulate outdoor lighting under other law or authority.
- Sec. 229.103. REGULATION OF OUTDOOR LIGHTING. (a) Except
- 19 as provided by Subsection (c) and subject to Subsection (b), the
- 20 governing body of a municipality that has received an International
- 21 Dark Sky Community designation by ordinance may regulate the
- 22 installation and use of outdoor lighting in the municipality and
- 23 the municipality's extraterritorial jurisdiction.
- 24 (b) An ordinance adopted under this section may not require

- 1 outdoor lighting constructed before the date the ordinance is
- 2 adopted to be brought into compliance with the ordinance before the
- 3 later of September 1, 2026, or the fifth anniversary of the date the
- 4 ordinance is adopted.
- 5 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), an ordinance under
- 6 this section may not apply to outdoor lighting that is:
- 7 (1) constructed before the date the ordinance is
- 8 adopted; and
- 9 (2) located on residential property with four or fewer
- 10 dwelling units located in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the
- 11 municipality.
- 12 (d) A municipality may apply an ordinance under this section
- 13 to outdoor lighting described by Subsection (c) that is part of a
- 14 renovation of a property.
- 15 Sec. 229.104. ENFORCEMENT; CIVIL PENALTY. (a) A
- 16 municipality may sue in any court to enjoin a violation of an
- 17 ordinance adopted under this subchapter.
- 18 (b) A person who violates an ordinance adopted under this
- 19 subchapter is liable for a civil penalty not to exceed \$500.
- 20 (c) A municipal court has original jurisdiction over a
- 21 violation of an ordinance adopted under Section 229.103 alleged to
- 22 <u>have occurred in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the</u>
- 23 municipality.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
