2	relating to a law enforcement agency accreditation grant program.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 772, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 772.0077 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 772.0077. LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY ACCREDITATION GRANT
7	PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "criminal justice division" means
8	the criminal justice division established under Section 772.006.
9	(b) The criminal justice division shall establish and
10	administer a grant program to provide financial assistance to a law
11	enforcement agency in this state for purposes of:
12	(1) obtaining or maintaining recognition through the
13	Texas Police Chiefs Association Law Enforcement Best Practices
14	Recognition Program;
15	(2) becoming accredited or maintaining accreditation
16	by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies,
17	<pre>Inc.; or</pre>
18	(3) becoming accredited or maintaining accreditation
19	by an association or organization designated by the criminal
20	justice division under Subsection (g).
21	(c) The amount of a grant awarded under this section may not
22	exceed \$50,000.
23	(d) The criminal justice division shall establish:
24	(1) eligibility criteria for grant applicants;

- 1 (2) grant application procedures;
- 2 (3) guidelines relating to grant amounts;
- 3 (4) procedures for evaluating grant applications; and
- 4 (5) procedures for monitoring the use of a grant
- 5 awarded under the program and ensuring compliance with any
- 6 conditions of a grant.
- 7 (e) Not later than December 1 of each year, the criminal
- 8 justice division shall submit to the Legislative Budget Board a
- 9 report that provides the following information for the preceding
- 10 state fiscal year:
- 11 (1) the name of each law enforcement agency that
- 12 applied for a grant under this section; and
- 13 (2) the amount of money distributed to each law
- 14 enforcement agency that received a grant under this section.
- 15 (f) The criminal justice division may use any revenue
- 16 available for purposes of this section.
- 17 (g) The criminal justice division, with the assistance of
- 18 the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement, shall periodically review
- 19 associations and organizations that establish standards of
- 20 practice for law enforcement agencies and that offer accreditation
- 21 to agencies that meet those standards. On a determination by the
- 22 criminal justice division that accreditation of law enforcement
- 23 agencies in this state by an association or organization would
- 24 benefit public safety, the commission may designate the association
- 25 or organization as an accrediting agency for purposes of Subsection
- 26 (b)(3).
- 27 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
