A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to establishing a Texas Service Corps to provide student loan relief, job training, and work experience, in exchange for 3 providing community service in underserved areas. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 4, Labor Code, is amended by adding Chapter 318 to read as follows: 7 CHAPTER 318. TEXAS SERVICE CORPS 8 9 Sec.318.001 ESTABLISHING A TEXAS SERVICE CORPS. (a) It is hereby established a Texas Service Corps, administered by the Texas 10 Workforce Commission. The Service Corps shall provide interested 11 12 applicants with service opportunities deemed most likely to further an applicant's stated educational and professional interests. The 13 14 services to be provided include, but are not limited to: (i) green jobs in service of activities or industries that 15 16 contribute substantially to preserving or restoring environmental 17 quality; (ii) health services by applicants with the necessary 18 qualifications to provide medical, dental, psychological, or other 19 related services as deemed appropriate by Service Corps 20 administration; 21 (iii) services that benefit the developmental and 22 23 educational needs of early childhood; and 24 (iv) services that provide exposure to, and participation

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1 in, the Arts or Humanities. 2 (b) Individuals who complete a term of service, shall be 3 eligible for an education grant to be used for either tuition costs at eligible Texas institutions of higher learning or student loan 4 5 repayment. 6 (c) Funding for the education grant shall be comprised of 7 any federal dollars allocated for implementing community service programs, with necessary additional funding allocated through 8 Texas budgetary procedures. 9 10 (d) The Texas Service Corps shall, in consultation with administrative agencies deemed relevant and necessary by the Texas 11 12 Legislature, have the following powers and duties: (i) to recruit and select Service Corps professionals for 13 14 service in eligible institutions, facilities, or professions; 15 (ii) to place Service Corps professionals in eligible institutions and facilities pursuant to agreements with the 16 17 appropriate eligible institutions and facilities; (iii) to develop criteria for the selection of applicants 18 19 for placement under this program including, but not limited to, the individual's academic achievement, previous work experience in the 20 relevant industry or related services, a demonstrated interest in 21 working with vulnerable populations or providing community 22 23 service; 24 (iv) to accept and expend any grants, awards or other funds or appropriations as may be available to effectuate the purposes of 25 26 this Act subject to the limitations as to the approval of expenditures and audit as prescribed for state funds by STATE 27

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1 finance law; and

2 (v) to do any and all other things necessary to carry out its 3 <u>functions</u>, powers and duties and to effectuate the purposes of this 4 Act.

5 <u>(e) The nature and extent of a proposed service project</u> 6 <u>shall be submitted in writing to the appropriate delegated</u> 7 <u>oversight entity prior to expending any public funds.</u>

8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
