4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter L, Chapter 411,
6	Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER L. STATEWIDE AMERICA'S MISSING: BROADCAST EMERGENCY
8	RESPONSE (AMBER) ALERT SYSTEM FOR ABDUCTED CHILDREN AND CERTAIN
9	OTHER MISSING PERSONS [WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES]
10	SECTION 2. Section 411.351, Government Code, is amended by
11	amending Subdivisions (2), (3), and (3-a) and adding Subdivision
12	(3-b) to read as follows:
13	(2) "Alert system" means the statewide America's
14	Missing: Broadcast Emergency Response (AMBER) alert system for
15	abducted children and <u>certain other</u> missing persons [with
16	<pre>intellectual disabilities].</pre>
17	(3) "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law

- enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of: 18
- 19 (A) the abduction of a child; [or]
- 20 a missing person with an intellectual (B)
- 21 disability; or
- (C) a missing person experiencing a mental health 22
- 23 <u>crisis</u>.
- 24 (3-a) "Person experiencing a mental health crisis"

- 1 means a person who is experiencing a mental health crisis and due to
- 2 that crisis poses a danger to the person or to others.
- 3 (3-b) "Pervasive developmental disorder" means a
- 4 disorder that meets the criteria for a pervasive developmental
- 5 disorder established in the most recent Diagnostic and Statistical
- 6 Manual of Mental Disorders published by the American Psychiatric
- 7 Association.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 411.352, Government Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 411.352. STATEWIDE AMERICA'S MISSING: BROADCAST
- 11 EMERGENCY RESPONSE (AMBER) ALERT SYSTEM FOR ABDUCTED CHILDREN AND
- 12 CERTAIN OTHER MISSING PERSONS [WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES].
- 13 With the cooperation of the Texas Department of Transportation, the
- 14 office of the governor, and other appropriate law enforcement
- 15 agencies in this state, the department shall develop and implement
- 16 a statewide alert system to be activated on behalf of an abducted
- 17 child, [or] a missing person with an intellectual disability, or a
- 18 missing person experiencing a mental health crisis.
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 411.355(b), Government Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 (b) On the request of a local law enforcement agency
- 22 regarding a missing person with an intellectual disability or a
- 23 missing person experiencing a mental health crisis, the department
- 24 shall activate the alert system and notify appropriate participants
- 25 in the alert system, as established by rule, if:
- 26 (1) the local law enforcement agency receives notice
- 27 of a missing person with an intellectual disability or a missing

- 1 person experiencing a mental health crisis;
- 2 (2) the local law enforcement agency verifies that at
- 3 the time the person is reported missing:
- 4 (A) the person, as applicable:
- 5 (i) has an intellectual disability, as
- 6 determined according to the procedure provided by Section 593.005,
- 7 Health and Safety Code; or
- 8 <u>(ii) is experiencing a mental health crisis</u>
- 9 and due to that crisis poses a danger to the person or to others; and
- 10 (B) the person's location is unknown;
- 11 (3) the local law enforcement agency determines that
- 12 the person's disappearance poses a credible threat to the person's
- 13 health and safety; and
- 14 (4) sufficient information is available to
- 15 disseminate to the public that could assist in locating the person.
- SECTION 5. Sections 411.358 and 411.359, Government Code,
- 17 are amended to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 411.358. TERMINATION. The director shall terminate
- 19 any activation of the alert system with respect to a particular
- 20 abducted child, [or a particular] missing person with an
- 21 intellectual disability, or missing person experiencing a mental
- 22 health crisis if:
- 23 (1) the abducted child or missing person is recovered
- 24 or the situation is otherwise resolved; or
- 25 (2) the director determines that the alert system is
- 26 no longer an effective tool for locating and recovering the
- 27 abducted child or missing person.

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- 1 Sec. 411.359. SYSTEM NAME. The director by rule may assign
- 2 a name other than America's Missing: Broadcast Emergency Response
- 3 (AMBER) to the alert system when the system is activated regarding a
- 4 missing person with an intellectual disability or a missing person
- 5 experiencing a mental health crisis.
- 6 SECTION 6. Not later than December 1, 2021, the Public
- 7 Safety Commission shall adopt rules and the public safety director
- 8 of the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas shall issue
- 9 directives necessary to implement Subchapter L, Chapter 411,
- 10 Government Code, as amended by this Act.
- 11 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
