## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to a continuing review and revision of the essential knowledge and skills of the public school foundation curriculum and 3 proclamations for the production of instructional materials. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 28.0026 to read as follows: 7 Sec. 28.0026. REVIEW AND REVISION OF ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE 8 9 AND SKILLS. (a) The State Board of Education shall: (1) conduct a review of the essential knowledge and 10 skills for the foundation curriculum adopted under Section 11 12 28.002(a)(1); and 13 (2) as necessary, revise the essential knowledge and 14 skills for that curriculum to narrow the number and scope of student expectations for each subject and grade level in accordance with 15 16 this section. (b) The scope of the essential knowledge and skills for each 17 subject and grade level of the foundation curriculum must: 18 (1) be more narrow than the scope of the essential 19 knowledge and skills adopted as of January 1, 2021; and 20 21 (2) require less time for a demonstration of mastery 22 than required for the essential knowledge and skills adopted as of 23 January 1, 2021. 24 (c) In complying with this section, the State Board of

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(1) consider for each subject and grade level, the time: (A) a teacher would require to provide comprehensive instruction on a particular student expectation; and (B) a typical student would require to master a particular student expectation; (2) determine whether, in light of the consideration required by Subdivision (1), each essential knowledge and skill of a subject can be comprehensively taught within the instruction time provided by Section 25.081, not including the amount of time required for testing; (3) determine whether the college and career readiness standards have been appropriately integrated in the essential knowledge and skills for each subject and grade level; and (4) consider whether an assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023 adequately assesses a particular student expectation.

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19 <u>(c-1) The State Board of Education must ensure that any</u> 20 <u>revision of the essential knowledge and skills for the foundation</u> 21 <u>curriculum performed before September 1, 2024, does not result in a</u> 22 <u>need for the adoption of new instructional materials. This</u> 23 <u>subsection expires September 1, 2025.</u>

(d) The State Board of Education shall adopt a schedule for
continuing the review and revision required by this section of the
essential knowledge and skills for each subject and grade level of
the foundation curriculum.

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1	SECTION 2. Section 31.002, Education Code, is amended by
2	adding Subdivision (1-b) to read as follows:
3	(1-b) "Proclamation" means a request for production of
4	instructional materials issued by the State Board of Education.
5	SECTION 3. Section 31.022, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), and (b-3) and amending Subsection
7	(f) to read as follows:
8	(b-1) For any state fiscal biennium, the board may only
9	issue proclamations for instructional materials in which the total
10	projected cost of instructional materials under the proclamations
11	does not exceed 75 percent of the total amount used to fund the
12	instructional materials and technology allotment under Section
13	31.0211 for that biennium.
14	(b-2) Following the adoption of revised essential knowledge
15	and skills for any subject, the board shall determine whether
16	issuance of a proclamation is necessary based on the significance
17	of the changes to the essential knowledge and skills. If the board
18	determines a proclamation is necessary, the board shall issue:
19	(1) a full call for instructional materials aligned to
20	all of the essential knowledge and skills for the subject and grade
21	level;
22	(2) a supplemental call for instructional materials
23	aligned to new or expanded essential knowledge and skills for the
24	subject and grade level;
25	(3) a call for new information demonstrating alignment
26	of current instructional materials to the revised essential
27	knowledge and skills; or

(4) any combination of the calls described by 1 2 Subdivisions (1), (2), and (3). (b-3) In determining the disbursement of money to the 3 available school fund and the amount of that disbursement that will 4 be used, in accordance with Section 43.001(d), to fund the 5 6 instructional materials and technology allotment under Section 31.0211, the board must consider the cost of all instructional 7 materials and technology requirements for that state fiscal 8 biennium. 9 The board shall amend any proclamation [request for 10 (f) production] issued for the purchase of instructional materials to 11 conform to the instructional materials funding levels provided by 12

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13 the General Appropriations Act for the year of implementation <u>and</u> 14 <u>to comply with Subsection (b-1)</u>.

SECTION 4. Sections 31.101(d) and (e), Education Code, are repealed.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
