## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the prima facie speed limit in residence districts.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Sections 545.356(b-1), (c), and (d),
- 5 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b-1) Except as provided by Subsection (b-3), the governing
- 7 body of a municipality, for a highway or a part of a highway in the
- 8 municipality that is not an officially designated or marked highway
- 9 or road of the state highway system, may declare a lower speed limit
- 10 of not less than 25 miles per hour, if the governing body determines
- 11 that the prima facie speed limit on the highway is unreasonable or
- 12 unsafe. A municipality is not required to perform an engineering or
- 13 traffic investigation to declare a lower speed limit under this
- 14 subsection if the street is located in a residence district.
- 15 (c) A prima facie speed limit that is altered by the
- 16 governing body of a municipality under Subsection (b)  $[\frac{1}{r}, \frac{(b-1)_r}{r}]$  or
- 17 (b-3) is effective when the governing body erects signs giving
- 18 notice of the new limit and at all times or at other times as
- 19 determined.
- 20 (d) The governing body of a municipality that declares a
- 21 lower speed limit on a highway or part of a highway under Subsection
- 22  $[\frac{(b-1) \text{ or}}{(b-3)}]$ , not later than February 1 of each year, shall
- 23 publish on its Internet website and submit to the department a
- 24 report that compares for each of the two previous calendar years:

- 1 (1) the number of traffic citations issued by peace
- 2 officers of the municipality and the alleged speed of the vehicles,
- 3 for speed limit violations on the highway or part of the highway;
- 4 (2) the number of warning citations issued by peace
- 5 officers of the municipality on the highway or part of the highway;
- 6 and
- 7 (3) the number of vehicular accidents that resulted in
- 8 injury or death and were attributable to speed limit violations on
- 9 the highway or part of the highway.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
