A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2 | relating to food allergen awareness in food service establishments. |
| 3 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 4 | SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Sergio Lopez Food |
| 5 | Allergy Awareness Act. |
| 6 | SECTION 2. Chapter 437, Health and Safety Code, is amended |
| 7 | by adding Section 437.026 to read as follows: |
| 8 | Sec. 437.026. FOOD ALLERGEN AWARENESS. (a) A food service |
| 9 | establishment shall display a poster relating to food allergen |
| 10 | awareness in an area of the establishment accessible primarily to |
| 11 | food service employees of the establishment. The department shall: |
| 12 | (1) determine the form and content of the poster; |
| 13 | (2) post a sample poster on the department's Internet |
| 14 | website; and |
| 15 | (3) update the poster as necessary to ensure that the |
| 16 | poster contains current information about food allergens and |
| 17 | remains consistent with standards promulgated by the United States |
| 18 | Food and Drug Administration. |
| 19 | (b) A food service establishment may display the |
| 20 | information from the sample poster in lieu of the poster, provided |
| 21 | the information is presented and posted in a manner that is easily |
| 22 | readable by the establishment's food service employees in the |
| 23 | selected employee area. |
| 24 | (c) The poster or posted information must: |

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| 1 | (1) state that a reaction to a food allergen is |

| 3 | (2) include information regarding: |
| 4 | (A) the risk of an allergic reaction to a food |

| 6 | (B) the major food allergens, including milk, |

| 9 | (C) the proper methods and procedures for |
| 10 | checking ingredients in food items, including unexpected or hidden |

| 15 | (E) methods for preventing cross-contact in food |

| 17 | (d) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary |

| 19 | (e) This section does not create a private cause of action |
| 20 | or change any common law or statutory duty. |
| 21 | SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2021: |
| 22 | (1) the Department of State Health Services shall |
| 23 | determine the form and content of the poster and post the sample |

| 26 | (2) the executive commissioner of the Health and Human |

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Section 437.026, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Section 437.026, Health and
Safety Code, as added by this Act, a food service establishment is
not required to comply with that section before January 1, 2022.
SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
