13	(A) to prevent physical injury to the child or
14	another person;
15	(B) because the child has a history of disruptive
16	courtroom behavior that has placed others in potentially harmful
17	situations; or
18	(C) because the child presents a substantial risk
19	of flight from the courtroom; and

- 5 Except as provided by Subsection (b), during a judicial proceeding,
- 6 a court shall permit a child to wear clothing other than a uniform

- 8 (1) the child's attorney requests the court's
- 9 permission for the child to wear other clothing; and
- 10 (2) the child's attorney or family member provides the
- 11 child with appropriate clothing.

- 15 (1) a substantial risk of the child's flight from the
