(a) A mechanical or 7 physical restraint may not be used on a child during a judicial 8 9 proceeding and any restraint must be removed before the child's appearance before the court unless the court finds that: 10 11 (1) the use of a mechanical or physical restraint is 12 necessary: (A) to prevent physical injury to the child or 13 14 another person; 15 (B) because the child has a history of disruptive 16 courtroom behavior that has placed others in potentially harmful 17 situations; or 18 (C) because the child presents a substantial risk 19 of flight from the courtroom; and 20 (2) the mechanical or physical restraint used is the least restrictive restraint effective to prevent the child's escape 21 or physical injury to the child or another person. 22 23 (b) The court shall provide the child's attorney an opportunity to be heard before the court may order the use of a 24

1	mechanical or physical restraint. If the use of a restraint is
2	ordered, the court shall make findings of fact in support of the
3	<u>order.</u>
4	Sec. 54.13. CLOTHING DURING JUDICIAL PROCEEDING. (a)
5	Except as provided by Subsection (b), during a judicial proceeding,
6	a court shall permit a child to wear clothing other than a uniform
7	provided by a detention or correctional facility if:
8	(1) the child's attorney requests the court's
9	permission for the child to wear other clothing; and
10	(2) the child's attorney or family member provides the
11	child with appropriate clothing.
12	(b) The court may deny an attorney's request under
13	Subsection (a) only if the court finds that granting the request
14	would present:
15	(1) a substantial risk of the child's flight from the
16	courtroom; or
17	(2) a safety risk to the child or another person.
18	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
